TO RESTORE AN ADDITIONAL 11 THIRTEEN (13) BURIED VALVE BOXES THAT HAD BEEN 12 PAVED OVER AS A SECOND CHANGE ORDER TO THE 13 PURCHASE ORDER FOR THE FDOT RFQ PAVING AND 14 MILLING PROJECT: AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE 15 DATE. 16 17 WHEREAS, pursuant to the Code of Ordinances of the City of Hallandale Beach. 18 Chapter 23, the City Manager's purchasing authority is \$50,000; and 19 WHEREAS, pursuant to Code of Ordinances, Section 23-10 (c), the City Manager, in 20 a matter of public necessity, may incur obligations or expend funds, not in excess of 21 22 \$50,000, provided that he places the ratification of these expenditures on the first regularly scheduled commission meeting occurring after the incursion or expenditure; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) recently initiated a planned project involving milling and resurfacing along Federal Highway (US-1), from 25 Pembroke Road to County Line Road, and as part of this project, the City was responsible 26 27 for raising all utility valve boxes, including those related to water, sewer, and stormwater 28 systems, to the new finished grade; and 29 WHEREAS, City staff proactively identified all known and visible valve boxes and 30 manhole lids; and

WHEREAS, on March 25, 2025, Public Works staff received responses to a Request For Quote (RFQ) for roadway repair services in which Palma Paving & Concrete, Inc. was awarded the RFQ with an estimated cost of the work of \$47,200, however, additional expenditures were identified and a total expenditure of sixty-five thousand eight hundred dollars (\$68,500) was approved by City Commission via Resolution Number 2025-101; and

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WHEREAS, during milling operations, the contractor uncovered another thirteen (13) additional buried valve boxes that had been paved over during previous resurfacing projects, likely due to outdated records or prior construction oversight, and to avoid delaying FDOT's schedule—which could have resulted in financial penalties, reputational harm, and potential safety concerns—the City directed Palma Paving & Concrete, Inc. to proceed immediately with the necessary adjustments and restorations; and

WHEREAS, Staff recommends the Mayor and City Commission find it in the public interest to authorize and ratify the incurring of expenses for the additional amount of Sixteen Thousand, Nine Hundred Dollars (\$16,900) paid on an emergency basis by the City to Palma Paving & Concrete, Inc. to restore an additional thirteen (13) buried valve boxes that had been paved over as a second change order to the Purchase Order for the FDOT RFQ paving and milling project, and authorize the City Manager to execute relating documents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:

**SECTION 1. Whereas Clauses.** The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are incorporated herein.

 **SECTION 2. Authority.** The Mayor and City Commission hereby authorize and ratify the incurring of expenses for the additional amount of Sixteen Thousand, Nine Hundred Dollars (\$16,900) paid on an emergency basis by the City to Palma Paving & Concrete, Inc. to restore an additional thirteen (13) buried valve boxes that had been paved over as a second change order to the Purchase Order for the FDOT RFQ paving and milling project, and authorize the City Manager to execute relating documents.

**SECTION 3.** Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage and adoption.
