### BOARD/COMMITTEE DESCRIPTION

The Quadrant Safety Board (QSB) embodies an innovative community policing approach, empowering appointed stakeholders residing and/or operating a business within each CRA quadrant to actively shape safety initiatives tailored to their communities. Convening monthly under the guidance of a dedicated police liaison, the QSB serves as a platform for community members to discuss, plan, and act on safety concerns in their neighborhoods. Comprised of five members nominated by the HBCRA Board of Directors, the QSB represents a diverse cross-section of residents and business owners deeply invested in the well-being of their neighborhoods. Through collaborative engagement, the QSB endeavors to foster stronger bonds between the Hallandale Beach Police Department and the community, striving for mutual understanding, trust, and addressing challenges afflicting our city.

**ACTIVITIES/ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

It is worth noting that via a resolution, the number of total members for the HBCRA Quadrant Safety Board was changed to five in total. This change was made to facilitate reaching quorum with three members present, as prior to this change, quorum was not accomplished until after said change in October of this year, finally allowing voting on issues discussed. Despite the limited number of meetings in which a quorum was reached (October and December), the following was accomplished:

Utilizing statistical data, the QSB convened monthly to discuss critical police initiatives and safety concerns across the four quadrants of the HBCRA. Over the past year, discussions have encompassed various topics, including illegal dumping, City Code issues, and violent crime. The board has also further discussed and evaluated the effectiveness of key police projects such as License Plate Readers, "ShotSpotter" gunshot detection system, parking issues, and drones. Additionally, neighborhood enhancement program options have been explored.

These ongoing dialogues have fostered a stronger rapport between law enforcement, QSB board members, and attendees.

**PRIORITY ACTIVITIES**

A predominant topic in QSB meetings was evaluating the manner in which board members are recruited and appointed to facilitate a larger pool of candidates. This request is being made to aim for a broader and more robust Quadrant Safety Board.

**BOARD/COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS**

HBCRA recommends the exploration of outreach strategies—such as community announcements, social media engagement, and collaboration with neighborhood associations—to attract a more diverse pool of applicants for the Quadrant Safety Board. Continued collaboration with community stakeholders and local partners may help build interest and support for board participation.
