RESOLUTION NO. 2017 -
A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY
COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH,
FLORIDA, SUPPORTING AND ADOPTING THE
SEPTEMBER 2017 BROWARD COUNTY ENHANCED
LOCAL MITIGATION STRATEGY; AND PROVIDING FOR
AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Hallandale Beach is located in an area that is vulnerable to natural and man-made disasters; and

WHEREAS, the City supports reasonable efforts to make the community better prepared for future disasters and better able to recover after disaster strikes; and

WHEREAS, the State of Florida has stipulated that a Local Mitigation Strategy (LMS) is the first step in the process of making a community better prepared to manage disasters; and

WHEREAS, the Broward County Local Mitigation Strategy (LMS) program is a comprehensive, cohesive and coordinated hazard mitigation program between Broward County and the thirty-one (31) municipalities within its boundaries to address emergency response/recovery issues, as well as planning and economic issues relating to mitigation; and

WHEREAS, the LMS was developed over a seven (7) year period, and adopted by the Broward County Board of County Commissioners in April 2005; and

WHEREAS, in March 2011, the County used a grant it received from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to create an Enhanced LMS (ELMS), which included components beyond what is required by the State of Florida and FEMA; and

WHEREAS, the Broward County Board of Commissioners adopted the ELMS on February 5, 2013; and

WHEREAS, FEMA approved the ELMS on March 12, 2013 for a period of five (5) years until March 12, 2018; and

30 **WHEREAS**, Broward County recently completed the 5 year update process for the
31 ELMS in September 2017 (Broward ELMS Update); and

32 **WHEREAS**, the Florida Division of Emergency Management has completed the
33 State of Florida review of the Broward ELMS Update for compliance with the federal
34 hazard mitigation planning standards contained in 44 CFR-201.6(b)-(d); and

35 **WHEREAS**, the Broward ELMS Update is deemed compliant with federal
36 standards subject to formal community adoption; and

37 **WHEREAS**, all 31 municipalities in Broward County must adopt the Broward
38 ELMS Update in order for it to receive final approval by the State of Florida; and

39 **WHEREAS**, approval and adoption of the Broward ELMS Update by the City of
40 Hallandale Beach is necessary in order to maintain eligibility for hazard mitigation project
41 grant funding.

42 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY**
43 **COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:**

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45 **Section 1.** That the foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed
46 as being true and correct and are hereby made a specific part of this Resolution upon
47 adoption hereof.

48 **Section 2.** The Mayor and City Commission of the City of Hallandale Beach hereby
49 approve and adopt the September 2017 Broward County Enhanced Local Mitigation
50 Strategy as approved by the Federal Emergency Management Agency as meeting all
51 current requirements for such a plan.

52 **Section 3.** The Mayor and City Commission of the City of Hallandale Beach hereby
53 direct the City Manager to appoint one primary and one alternate City Employee to
54 participate in the Local Mitigation Strategy Working Group to ensure the City of Hallandale
55 Beach is represented on all matters.

56 **Section 4.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage and
57 adoption.
