RESOLUTION NO. 2017 -

**A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA;
AFFIRMING THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH’S
COMMITMENT TO THE PARIS CLIMATE ACCORD; STATING
THAT THE CITY WILL STRIVE TO MEET THE GOALS AND
OBJECTIVES LAID FORTH IN THE ACCORD BY
PERFORMING A GREENHOUSE GAS INVENTORY AS
SOON AS FEASIBLE AND TAKING THE NECESSARY
STEPS TO REDUCE GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS;
PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, there is scientific consensus regarding the reality of climate change and the recognition that human activity, especially the combustion of fossil fuels that create greenhouse gases, is an important driver of climate change; and

WHEREAS, climate change has been widely recognized by government, business and academic leaders as a worldwide threat with the potential to harm our economy, safety, public health, and quality of life; and

WHEREAS, the City of Hallandale Beach (“City”) actively collaborates with other local governments throughout our region, state, nation, and the world to learn from each other and identify win-win opportunities to take action on climate change while creating measurable benefits in our communities; and

WHEREAS, the Paris Climate Accord, also known as the Paris Agreement, is an international agreement within the United Nations Framework on Climate Change; and

WHEREAS, the Paris Climate Accord arose from a pact on December 12, 2015 among representatives of 196 nations, to take action to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and slow the rise in global temperatures; and

WHEREAS, President Donald Trump’s announcement seeking to withdraw the United States of America from the Paris Agreement undermines this critical global effort to confront one of the greatest challenges facing our community and communities all across the planet; and

33 **WHEREAS**, the reality of climate change has not been affected by recent political
34 announcements; and

35 **WHEREAS**, more than eighty-six (86) mayors representing more than 40 million
36 Americans have recently re-affirmed their cities' commitments to climate action; and

37 **WHEREAS**, the absence of federal leadership only increases the importance of
38 local leadership in avoiding the most dangerous and costly effects of climate change; and

39 **WHEREAS**, the City has not yet adopted a greenhouse gas reduction plan.
40 However, the Sustainability Action Planning (SAP) process which launched in mid-June
41 2017 will include a large scale data collection effort that will help to facilitate the creation
42 of a greenhouse gas reduction plan in the near future; and

43 **WHEREAS**, the City is committed to taking action on climate change through a
44 global coalition of cities, state and national governments and leaders in the public and
45 private sector who recognize the importance and potential of these actions to protect and
46 enhance the well-being of current and future generations.

47 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY**
48 **COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:**

50 **SECTION 1.** The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby incorporated herein.

51 **SECTION 2.** The Mayor and City Commission of Hallandale Beach affirm the City's
52 commitment to the Paris Climate Accord and state that the City will strive to meet the goals
53 and objectives laid forth in the Accord by performing a greenhouse gas inventory as soon
54 as feasible and taking the necessary steps to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

55 **SECTION 3.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage and
56 adoption.
