





Dixie Highway Lane Repurposing Public Engagement Summary

This document summarizes the multiple public engagement activities associated with the Dixie Highway Lane Repurposing Study jointly conducted by the City of Hollywood and the City of Hallandale Beach.

The public engagement summary followed Broward County's "Community Awareness Plan" Guidelines for Lane Elimination Proposals.

Public Engagement Workshop

A public meeting/workshop for the project was held on August 28, 2021, between 6:00 PM and 8:00 PM. The workshop was structured in a hybrid format, allowing for both virtual and in-person participation by the public. A live presentation of the project overview and proposed recommendations was provided using Zoom Webinar that could be viewed online or in-person. Participants who wanted to attend the workshop virtually were asked to pre-register for the Zoom Webinar through the online project site. Those who preferred to attend in person were able to view the live presentation at the City of Hallandale Beach Cultural Center where City staff were available to answer questions. All submitted comments and questions were received and answered live during the webinar.

The following is a summary of the feedback and comments received during the public workshop.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS RECEIVED DURING THE WORKSHOP

- Trees Trees Trees for sidewalks. As a resident of Downtown Hollywood shaded walkways are important.
- What is this going to cost the city of Hollywood?
- Palms are not trees. We need shade trees.
- The segments In Downtown Hollywood need to maintain three lanes to accommodate adequate turn lane stacking. Do you have those to see? Can the greenway/bike lanes be protected with a curb or other physical protection? Thanks
- What is the timing/funding horizon on this with the MPO?
- Why must traffic lanes be taken away when there are grassy areas along the train tracks? Shutting down traffic lanes should be a last resort, not the motivation for the project. This is what scares people away when the anti-car ideology takes over. Please respond.
- Please address why the motive of the project has to be to limit cars, not create usable features for the public while improving all features of the roadway for all users.
- Where there's proposed on street parking, consider swapping the bike lane with the parking spaces so the parked cars and parking spaces act as a barrier between cyclists and moving

cars. It also reduces the door opening collisions between drivers and cyclists because cyclists are on the passenger side of the car. Plus cars aren't crossing bike lanes to park and reenter drive lanes.

 An excellent plan. However, unless the timing of street lights is address on all roads, especially Hallandale beach Blvd. and Pembroke Road where it often takes 15 minutes to drive the 3 miles, the level of frustration, air pollution and speeding seems more important to me.to try to make lights that go red, green, red forcing unnecessary stops.

Please note that the proposed construction timeframe is unknown since the project is not currently funded for construction in the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The flyer mentions that the project is part of the MPO's Complete Streets Initiative.

A hard copy of the project flyer was mailed to homeowners, business owners, tenants, and operators within 300 feet of the Dixie Highway project corridor three (3) weeks before the public engagement workshop.













A DIET THAT WORKS

Dixie Highway/1st Avenue/21st Avenue Lane Repurposing Project





What is a road diet?

A road diet is a reconfiguration in which motor vehicle travel lanes that have traffic volumes well under capacity are reduced to make space for other uses like for pedestrians, bicyclists, on-street parking, and landscaping. Lane repurposing projects can build safety into the road system by calming traffic, reducing speeding, and lowering the likelihood of crashes by up to 47% (Federal Highway Administration). The reclaimed space is an opportunity to implement projects that improve the quality of life for people of all ages and abilities in the community.

Where is it proposed?

As part of the Broward "Complete Streets" initiative, the City of Hollywood and the City of Hallandale Beach are preparing to transform sections of the Dixie Highway corridor between NE 215th Street and Sheridan Street. This section of roadway currently has additional travel lanes in each direction that are proven to have excess capacity. The plan for this Complete Streets Improvement Project is to repurpose a lane for safety and mobility improvements.

How do we know there's excess capacity?

In preparation for this improvement project, the City of Hollywood and the City of Hallandale Beach collaborated on a traffic study for the corridor. The study found that with the implementation of the Complete Streets methodology, traffic flow on this corridor will continue to operate at adopted standards, including during peak traffic periods.

How will the reclaimed space be utilized?

The plan recommends transforming the Dixie Highway and 1st/21st Avenue corridor, using the Complete Streets methodology. The goal of the plan is to create a safer corridor; provide access for a proposed Tri-Rail Coastal Link commuter rail station; link several residential and commercial neighborhoods; build a section of the Flagler Greenway Trail; and transform the corridor into a beautiful and functional area that suits the needs of all users.









What types of projects are being considered?

- Wider Sidewalks Expanded sidewalks to allow for more pedestrian traffic and alternative forms of transportation.
- On-Street Parking in commercial areas Dedicated space to allow for on-street parking.
- Street Trees and Landscaping Buffers A visual barrier along the street that consists of trees or shrubs to help beautify the area and improve pedestrian and bicycle safety.
- Buffered Bicycle Lanes Buffered bicycle lanes with door zone and striped or painted buffer to increase separation between bicyclists and motorists.
- Space for enhanced transit stops areas.
- Separated Greenway Trail Separation along the proposed Flagler Greenway Trail identified in the Broward County Greenways Master Plan in an effort to prevent bicycle-car collisions.








Question: How safe do you feel from accidents on Dixie Highway/1st Avenue/21st Avenue while driving?










Question: I feel comfortable using Dixie Highway/1st Avenue/21st Avenue when I am driving by car.






Question: I feel comfortable using Dixie Highway/1st Avenue/21st Avenue when I am walking.






Question: How important is it to you to improve the following on Dixie Highway/1st Avenue/21st Avenue-Increasing bicycle safety?






Question: How important is it to you to improve the following on Dixie Highway/1st Avenue/21st Avenue- Reducing motor vehicle speeds?






Question: How important is it to you to improve the following on Dixie Highway/1st Avenue/21st Avenue-Improving property values?







Question: What is your top concern about transportation in your neighborhood?










Question: How long have you lived in Hollywood/Hallandale Beach?






Question: Do you own a business within a half-mile of Dixie Highway/1st Avenue/21st Avenue?





- Please include protective barriers between vehicle and bike lanes, without them the bike lanes will just get taken over by cars.
- Why don't we have this project for A1A which is the most important bike spot of the whole city!!!
- More information on how Broward Transits plans to fit train stations along Dixie Highway
- There are constantly accidents on the corner of Dixie Hwy and Tyler Street resulting in property damage. This happens multiple times a year due to poorly timed traffic lights and poor lane markings.
