13	WHEREAS, Chapter 23, Section 23-4, of the City of Hallandale Beach Code of			
14	Ordinances, Competitive Bidding Required, provides that all purchases of and contracts for			
15	equipment, supplies and contractual services, when the estimated cost exceeds \$50,000,			
16	shall be based on competitive bids, and pursuant to Chapter 23, Section 23-6, Award of			
17	Contract, the City Manager shall have the authority to recommend to the City Commission			
18	award of contracts; and

20	WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) recently initiated a			
21	planned project #PNE4W89 milling and resurfacing along Federal Highway (US-1), from			
22	Pembroke Road to County Line Road, and as part of this project, the City was responsible			
23	for raising all utility valve boxes, including those related to water, sewer, and stormwater			
24	systems, to the new finished grade to ensure ongoing access, proper functionality, and			
25	compliance with FDOT standards; and			
26	WHEREAS, City staff proactively identified all known and visible valve boxes and			
27	manhole lids and because the estimated cost of this work was Forty-Seven Thousand, Two			
28	Hundred Dollars (\$47,200), a Purchase Order (#20250949) for Fifty Thousand Dollars			
29	(\$50,000) to Palma Paving & Concrete, Inc. for Contract #PNE4W89 was approved			
30	administratively by the City Manager in accordance with City Ordinance and Procurement			
31	Policy was issued to Palma Paving to complete the necessary adjustments; and

likely due to outdated records or prior construction oversight, and to avoid delaying FDOT's

additional buried valve boxes that had been paved over during previous resurfacing projects,

WHEREAS, during milling operations, the FDOT contractor uncovered eight (8)

schedule—which could have resulted in financial penalties, reputational harm, and potential safety concerns—the City directed Palma Paving & Concrete, Inc. to proceed immediately with the necessary adjustments and restorations costing an additional Fifteen Thousand, Eight Hundred Dollars (\$15,800); and

WHEREAS, the additional work increased the total cost of services provided by Palma Paving & Concrete, Inc. beyond the City Manager's procurement authority, staff proceeded in the best interest of the City and now seeks City Commission ratification of the expense to ensure compliance with financial procedures and project closeout requirements; and

WHEREAS, Staff recommends that the Mayor and City Commission find it to be in the public interest to ratify the final total amount paid to Palma Paving & Concrete, Inc. for FDOT Contract #PNE4W89 of Sixty-Five Thousand, Eight Hundred Dollars (\$65,800), which exceeded the City Manager's Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) administrative approval authority by Fifteen Thousand, Eight Hundred Dollars (\$15,800) upon the subsequent identification of unknown factors, and authorize the City Manager to execute relating documents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. Whereas Clauses. The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are incorporated herein.

The Mayor and City Commission hereby ratify the final total cost of Purchase Order (#20250949) to Palma Paving & Concrete, Inc. for FDOT Contract #PNE4W89 of Sixty-Five Thousand, Eight Hundred Dollars (\$65,800), which exceeded the City Manager's Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) administrative approval authority by Fifteen Thousand, Eight Hundred Dollars (\$15,800), and authorize the City Manager to execute relating documents.

SECTION 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage and adoption.
