SHORT TITLE:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 19 – OFFENSES AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS, ARTICLE I. – IN GENERAL, BY ADDING SECTION 19-24, SPEED DETECTION SYSTEMS FOR THE ENFORCEMENT OF SCHOOL ZONE SPEED LIMITS; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

STAFF SUMMARY:

Summary:

Staff respectfully request approval to amend the City of Hallandale Beach Code of Ordinances to authorize and implement a School Zone Speed Camera Enforcement Program in compliance with Florida Statute 316.008(9)(c).

Background:

On February 4, 2026, the City of Hallandale Beach approved and executed an agreement with Blue Line Solutions, LLC authorizing participation in a competitively solicited contract between Blue Line Solutions, LLC and the Town of Pembroke Park for the implementation of a school zone speed camera enforcement program in Hallandale Beach.

This agreement permits the City to utilize the existing competitively procured contract framework to deploy automated speed detection systems within designated school zones, in accordance with State law and established procurement standards (Exhibit #2). The anticipated implementation of the program is projected for July 2026.

Current Situation:

The proposed amendment will establish the regulatory framework necessary to utilize automated speed detection systems within designated school zones in the City of Hallandale Beach during prescribed times. This program is intended to enhance traffic safety, reduce speeding violations, and provide an additional layer of protection for students, parents, and school staff.

Implementation of the program will align with all statutory requirements, including signage, public awareness notifications, vendor procurement standards, and due process procedures for citation issuance. The enforcement initiative will serve as a proactive measure to improve roadway safety and promote compliance with posted school zone speed limits.

A traffic study was conducted during the week of November 14, 2025, to November 20, 2025, identifying the zones below as areas with a speeding issue. During the morning hours, the combined traffic was 12,025 vehicles, to which 3,714 were speeding at or above 11 MPHs above the posted speed limit. Similar data showed during the afternoon hours the combined traffic was 8,260 vehicles, to which 3,616 were speeding. (See Exhibit 3 for further details)

The School Zones are listed below:

1. Gulfstream Academy (North and South in the 200-500 blk of SW 8th Ave.)
2. Gulfstream Academy/Hallandale High School (East and West in the 700-1000 blk of W. Hallandale Beach Blvd)
3. Hallandale High School (East and West in the 700-900 blk of Foster Rd)
4. Hallandale High School (East in the 800-1000 blk of W. Pembroke Rd)
5. Lanier James/Hallandale High School (North and South in the 500-900 blk of Ansin Blvd)

This traffic initiative is expected to reduce the total amount of speeding vehicles by 95%.

Why Action is Necessary:

Approval of this Ordinance is required to ensure compliance with Florida Statute 316.008(9)(c), which governs the authorization and implementation of school zone speed detection and enforcement programs. The statute establishes the legal framework for municipalities to operate automated speed enforcement systems, including requirements
