4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16	A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING DRAFTING OF AN ORDINANCE AND APPLICATION TO THE FLORIDA FISH AND WILDLIFE CONSERVATION COMMISSION TO DESIGNATE A YEAR-ROUND SLOW SPEED ZONE IN THE INTRACOASTAL WATERWAY IN HALLANDALE BEACH; SEEKING CONSULTATION AND COORDINATION WITH BROWARD COUNTY AND OTHER APPLICABLE ENTITIES FOR SLOW SPEED ORDINANCE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.			
17	WHEREAS, for many years prior to 1996 the Intracoastal Waterway in Hallandale Beach			
18	was designated a slow speed, minimum wake zone from shore to shore; and			
19				
20	WHEREAS, the Hallandale Beach slow speed zone was thereafter redesignated as a			
21	bifurcated boating restricted area where commercial and recreational vessels and personal			
22	watercraft can legally speed up to 25 miles per hour in the center of the Intracoastal Waterway,			
23	but must maintain slow speed in the 50-foot buffers of either shore of the Intracoastal to protect			
24	manatees and help ensure boating safety;			
25				
26	WHEREAS, directly south of Hallandale Beach, in the Intracoastal Waterway bounded			
27	by the Town of Golden Beach and the City of Aventura, the Florida Fish and Wildlife			
28	Commission (FWC) maintained a slow speed zone, even though that segment of Intracoastal			
29	Waterway is wider and lacks dangerous blind corners and launching/landing facilities present in			
30	Hallandale Beach; many boaters enter the Hallandale Beach Intracoastal Waterway at			
31	significant speeds sometimes in excess of the legal limit; and			
32				
33	WHEREAS, in the intervening years the Intracoastal Waterway in Hallandale Beach has			
34	attracted increasing levels of usage from residents and tourists alike; there has been a			
35	proliferation of livery operations that send numerous boaters into this narrow thoroughfare;			
36	dangerous blind corners and unregulated launching/landing facilities create perils for boaters;			
37	rising sea levels overflow residential seawalls and boaters often enter the existing 50-foot			
38	buffers at high speeds throwing large wakes onto the contiguous properties; and

40	WHEREAS, the Intracoastal Waterway in Hallandale Beach is a narrow waterway		
41	measuring just under 300-feet from shore to shore, the wakes reverberate off the seawalls		
42	creating a peril particularly for small vessels; and		
43			
44	WHEREAS, the year-round presence of boats and personal watercrafts, oftentimes		
45	which are operated recklessly, without regard to the slow speed zone buffers, sometimes by		
46	operators under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs, and other times operated by		
47	inexperienced individuals, results in unsafe levels of vessel traffic congestion that create a		
48 49	significant risk of collision, and a significant threat to boating safety and to the manatees; and		
50	WHEREAS, a over 200 boating citations have been issued between the months of		
51	August through November alone; and		
52			
53	WHEREAS, Florida Statutes Section 327.46(1)(c)(2) authorizes municipalities, upon		
54	approval of the FWC, to establish a slow speed, minimum wake zone for 1) an area within 300		
55	feet of a blind corner and for 2) an area that presents a significant risk of collision or threat to		
56	boating safety as demonstrated by uniform boating citations, both conditions present in the		
57	subject waterway; and		
58			
59	WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission find it is in the best interest of the residents		
60	to pursue an ordinance and application to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation		
61	Commission to designate a year-round slow speed zone in the waterway more specifically		
62	identified in Exhibit A.		
63			
64	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT DULY RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY		
65	COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH FLORIDA:		
66			
67	SECTION 1. The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby confirmed as true and		
68	incorporated herein.		
69			
70	SECTION 2. The Mayor and City Commission urge the Florida Fish and Wildlife		
71	Conservation Commission to expressly designate the Intracoastal Waterway in Hallandale		
72	Beach as a year-round slow speed minimum wake zone.

74	SECTION 3. The Mayor and City Commission hereby authorize the City Attorney to			
75	prepare a draft ordinance for the consideration of the City Commission to enact a slow speed,			
76	minimum wake zone in the area identified in Exhibit A. The City Manager is further directed to			
77	submit the instant resolution and an initial draft of the proposed ordinance to Broward County,			
78	and, if applicable, to the United States Coast Guard, and the United States Army Corps of			
79	Engineers for consultation and coordination prior to the City Commission's consideration of the			
80	ordinance.

82	SECTION 4. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its			
83	passage and adoption.
