SHORT TITLE:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 9, "CODE COMPLIANCE," SECTION 9-46 "MITIGATION," OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH CODE OF ORDINANCES TO REVISE THE MITIGATION DELEGATION AND AUTHORIZE FULL RELEASE OF CODE **ENFORCEMENT** LIENS ON **HALLANDALE** COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY PROPERTY: **PROVIDING** FOR **CODIFICATION**; **PROVIDING** SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

STAFF SUMMARY:

Summary:

Pursuant to Chapter 9, Section 9-46, the City Commission has delegated authority to the City Manager and his designees to mitigate code enforcement fines and liens. Staff recommends revisions to that section to reflect the current mitigation policy adopted by way of Resolution 2023-015.

Further, according to Florida Statute 163.370(2)(c)(1), the Hallandale Beach Community Redevelopment Agency (HBCRA) is authorized to acquire property for the elimination of slum and blight to facilitate redevelopment in targeted areas. The HBCRA seeks to acquire certain real property for redevelopment and revitalization, however the properties may be encumbered by code enforcement liens. The recommended Code amendments would streamline the code section and permit the public purpose of redevelopment and revitalization of areas within the HBCRA.

Why Action is Necessary:

Pursuant to Article V, Section 5.01 of the City of Hallandale Beach Charter, an Ordinance must be adopted by the City Commission.

Cost Benefit:

There is no direct cost the City in lien releases where liens would otherwise be paid by the City or its special dependent district for property it has acquired for a public purpose.

PROPOSED ACTION:

The City Commission consider the attached Resolution and approve the attached Ordinance on First Reading and schedule the Second Reading on November 20, 2024.
