**RESOLUTION NO. 2025 -**

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION  
OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA,  
AUTHORIZING AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH  
BROWARD COUNTY FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE  
BROWARD RAPID ALERT AND INFORMATION NETWORK  
(RAIN) PROGRAM TO INSTALL FLOOD-MONITORING  
SITES WITHIN THE CITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN  
EFFECTIVE DATE.

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the City of Hallandale Beach Code of Ordinances, Section 23-9, Award, (e), the City Manager may award procurements within the delegated spending authority, and all other procurements, except emergency procurements, require commission approval for award; and

**WHEREAS**, Broward County has developed the Broward Rapid Alert and Information Network (“RAIN”), an advanced flood early-warning system to assist municipalities in monitoring and responding to flood-prone areas utilizing urban flood units equipped with water-level sensors, telemetry, solar power, and data-logging technology to transmit real-time hydrologic conditions during severe weather events and partners with municipalities by providing and installing the primary equipment needed for the system; and

**WHEREAS**, because the City of Hallandale Beach experiences significant localized flooding during heavy rainfall events and king tides, participation in the RAIN program will provide the City with immediate access to real-time hydrologic data, enabling faster response times for the Department of Public Works and emergency operations, improved public safety through alert systems and road-closure decisions, enhanced long-term planning for stormwater improvements and data-driven justification for future grants and resiliency investments; and

**WHEREAS**, in addition to the City of Hallandale Beach, the cities of Hollywood and Fort Lauderdale are in discussions with Broward County regarding the installation of RAIN units within their communities; and

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38       **WHEREAS**, Broward County is proposing to install between 10 and 15 RAIN units at  
39 monitoring sites within the City of Hallandale Beach, based on mutually identified flood-prone  
40 areas, each unit having an estimated equipment value of approximately \$10,000, which is  
41 fully funded by Broward County, and the City will be responsible for the site-specific  
42 preparation work, including permitting, digging, and constructing catch basins or concrete  
43 foundations to house the sensors and support equipment and, once installed and  
44 commissioned, the City will pay an annual maintenance fee of \$1,000 per site to Broward  
45 County, consistent with the proposed agreement terms; and

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47       **WHEREAS**, Staff recommends that the Mayor and City Commission find it to be in the  
48 public interest to authorize the negotiation of an interlocal agreement with Broward County  
49 for participation in the Broward Rapid Alert and Information Network (RAIN) program to install  
50 approximately 10 to 15 flood-monitoring sites within the City of Hallandale Beach, provide  
51 high-value equipment at no cost to the City, and support critical flood-mitigation operations,  
52 for which the City will prepare sites and pay the County an annual maintenance fee of \$1,000  
53 per site, and authorize the City Manager to execute the relating RAIN ILA once the parties  
54 have agreed on a final version consistent with this resolution.

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56       **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY  
57 COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:**

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59       **SECTION 1. Whereas Clauses.** The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are incorporated  
60 herein.

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62       **SECTION 2. Authorization.** The Mayor and City Commission hereby authorize the  
63 negotiation of an interlocal agreement with Broward County for participation in the Broward  
64 Rapid Alert and Information Network (RAIN) program to install approximately 10 to 15 flood-  
65 monitoring sites within the City of Hallandale Beach, provide high-value equipment at no cost  
66 to the City, and support critical flood-mitigation operations, for which the City will prepare sites  
67 and pay the County an annual maintenance fee of \$1,000 per site, and authorize the City  
68 Manager to execute the relating RAIN ILA once the parties have agreed on a final version  
69 consistent with this resolution.
