a) Flooding Concerns

- Flooding, especially the June event affecting homes in the southwest and northeast parts of the city.
- Issues with malfunctioning drains due to clogging.
- Sanitary sewer backups during the June flood.

b) Infrastructure Improvement Requests

• Request for additional pump stations to be added to the city's operations.

c) Communication & Public Information

- Request for improved public communication on the city's flood control and protection efforts.
- Request for updates on city events, such as Sustainability Board meetings.

 Suggestion for tax credits or other forms of compensation for residents affected by the flood.

6. BOARD/COMMITTEE BUSINESS

• City Liaison Updates

- ✓ City Vulnerability Assessment Project
 The City's Vulnerability Assessment project has officially launched, with the kickoff meeting scheduled for September 17th. Public participation is a key component of the project, and all board members, as well as other stakeholders, will be invited to engage in reviewing the project results and exploring opportunities to address identified issues.
- ✓ Introducing Climate Change Simulation Platform-End-Roads Will be presented by City liaison in the next Board meeting.
- ✓ In response to the heavy rainfall in June, the City convened a meeting to update, develop, and enhance the Emergency Operations Center (EOC). The meeting resulted in a list of action items, including securing emergency supplies, creating a detailed inventory of high-risk areas, and improving flood advisory technology and monitoring systems and adding more flood control equipment such as pumps and Vac trucks.

Board Members Updates

✓ Youth Climate Action Fund- Composting Project Avery Teifeld was awarded \$3,500 for her initiative, Project Compost. The project focuses on educating Hallandale Beach and other Broward County residents about the impacts of climate change, how to implement composting at home, and the role composting plays in mitigating the growing climate crisis.

- ✓ Gene 40: Express interest via google form for support green schooling.
- ✓ David Cox stated that the storm drains in his southwest neighborhood are malfunctioning and suggested a pump station on SW 6th Terrace to resolve the issue. He also emphasized the importance of enhancing and expanding storm drainage capacity to effectively address flooding issues, as cleaning the drainage system after the June event did not resolve the problem adequately following a brief storm in August.

New Business

Motions passed by the Board

- Motion recommending the City Commission allocate time for residents affected by the June flood to share their experiences and concerns. The motion also included providing an opportunity for residents to discuss ongoing preparations for future storms. All four members voted in favor.
- Motion requesting that the scope of work for the City's upcoming Vulnerability Assessment project, along with previous Vulnerability Assessment reports and the floodplain management plan, be shared with the board members. All four members voted in favor.
