# Citywide Records Mgmt

The Citywide Records Management Project aims to establish a comprehensive and standardized records management system across all city departments. This project is designed to ensure the effective and efficient management of the city's records, improve compliance with legal and regulatory requirements, enhance information accessibility, and preserve the city's historical and administrative documents. The project seeks to promote transparency, accountability, and operational efficiency within the city government by implementing a unified records management strategy and digitization of all City Records.

- **City Commission Approval:** Unanimously agreed on January 30, 2012, to present the Records Management Plan finalized in December 2011. On February 7, 2024, City Commission authorizing the City Clerk to execute a professional services agreement with John Scott Dailey, Florida Institute of Government at Florida Atlantic University, in partnership with SML, Inc. to update the 2011 Records Management Plan.
- **Need for Update:** Ongoing monitoring and updates needed for legal compliance, cost-effectiveness, and efficiency.
- **Increasing Complexity:** Due to evolving regulations, technologies, and public demands.
- **Team Leads:** City Clerk's Office, IT Department, and ACM Noemy Sandoval
- **Legal Compliance:** Essential to comply with Florida Statute Chapter 119 and F.A.C. Chapter 1B-24.
- **Project Deliverables:** An updated Records Management Plan for monitoring regulations, designing systems, and training to all stakeholders.
- **Timeline:** This is an ongoing project that is crucial to the lifeline of city records, with no definitive end date. While the initial phases, including the selection of a vendor, digitization of priority records, system deployment, and continuous staff training, are anticipated to begin initial phases within 18-24 months, the project will continue indefinitely. Ongoing updates, maintenance, and adjustments will be made to ensure the long-term integrity and accessibility of city records.





## Utility Revenue Bond Kick-Off & Reimbursement Resolution

The entire Bond Team met to discuss the timeline of the revenue bonds for issuance by December 2025. A reimbursement resolution was presented for approval on 5/21/25 to appropriate the Tranche 2 projects in anticipation of the financing.

## Bond Feasibility & Engineering Reports

The Team is working with Raftelis Financial Advisors and two engineering firms on an updated feasibility report. We are currently exploring other FA's for our next rate study and feasibility study. Timeline was extended to allow for September YE to finish so that the report can be updated with FY2025 information.

## Draft Bond Resolution

Review key financial, legal, and engineering findings to frame the preliminary bond resolution and confirm alignment with project funding needs.

## Draft POS

Prepare the Preliminary Official Statement (POS), including financial disclosures, project scope summaries, and bond structure details for underwriter and legal review.

## Bond Resolution – Commission Approval

Following staff and legal review, the final bond resolution will be submitted to the Commission for adoption to authorize bond issuance and proceed to market.


## Closing

### Rehab & New Construction

**Streetlighting Improvements**,  
Per FPL representative (Amanda Natskakula) , the project is nearing completion. FPL sub-contractor (PIKE) is in the process of restoring project areas. The agency is pending as-built drawings, progress and completion photos.

### Traffic Calming

Construction 95 LLC was awarded bid # FY 2024-2025-CRA02 HBCRA SPEED HUMPS during the November 2025 HBCRA Board meeting. The contractor's agreement was received on 12.10.25 and is pending final execution. Once the agency receives the executed agreement, staff will proceed to open a P.O. and schedule a kickoff meeting.

### Art Trail

During an RFI inquiry, it was determined that electrical plans may be required for this project. A meeting with the HBCRA, Kimley-Horn, and BCI is scheduled for 1.9.27 to discuss hardwire vs solar option. Delivery of the GMP is on schedule for Jan 2026.

### FEC Parking lot Improvement (NE 1st Ave)

The latest communication regarding this project occurred on 12.10.25. Deputy Chief Thouez is in the process of executing the final lease, pending comments from the City attorney and a discussion with HBCRA/FEC regarding the installation of a fence/barricade.

### NE 1st Ave Streetscape Improvements

Recently, Ranger installed portions of the sidewalk on the East and West sides of NE 1st Ave, as well as installing 68 linear feet of the valley gutter and a portion of the F-curb. Some of the ongoing conflicts include FDOT approval, relocation of the existing gas lines, and incidental water line breaks. To date, phase 1 of the project is on schedule.

### Hallandale City Center Food hall Incubator

On 11.13.25, the agency received S&S plumbing plans for the installation of grease interceptors. The HBCRA is pending a quote from H&M Development for the installation of the grease traps. Once received, the agency will review the estimate. If approved, staff will proceed; if not, staff will work with the COHB procurement team to release a bid to solicit qualified contractors for the installation of the traps.

### 538 NW 6th, 610 NW 6th Ave, & 617 NW 4th Ave

The latest communication regarding this project occurred on 12.15.25. The HBCRA construction consultant and the surety company rep met to discuss viable options and determined that traditional construction is the best route. The HBCRA construction consultant is currently attaining quotes for design-build options. After receiving these estimates, the next step will be to schedule another meeting with the surety to evaluate the viability, address financial obligations, and confirm commitments.

### 627- 631 SW 6th Ter Rehabilitation

DRC comments were received December 4, 2025. The HBCRA design team responded to DRC comments on December 10, 2025 by compiling a list of decisions needed from the agency. The agency is working to resolve DRC comments, while completing the permitting process for demolition.

### 1016-1018 SW 8th St

FPL disconnect letters have been received. The agency will proceed with demolishing the existing structures while awaiting design-build proposals for the traditional construction of a multi-family dwelling.

### 632 SW 6th Ter Rehabilitation

The ITB for this project was released on 11.20.25. Bids are due back to the agency on 12.18.25. Plans are on their 2nd round of review with the COHB building department. Staff anticipates beginning the renovation for this project in February 2026


### 128-132 SE 2nd Ter (21 –unit apartment complex)

Installation of citywide chargers at the City Hall municipal complex, Fire Station, and at the DPW compound




