The exemption would cover the property's value between \$100,000 and 35 36 \$150,000. This amendment shall take effect January 1, 2023; and 37

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WHEREAS, this Constitutional amendment, if approved by 60% of Florida voters, would save eligible recipients an average of \$540 per year; and
