36	amicus brief for mayors and cities to submit in support the position of the Colorado Civil
37	Rights Commission, with over 50 mayors and 50 cities signing onto the brief; and

WHEREAS, the enforcement of state and local non-discrimination laws is critical
to City's goals of ensuring equal treatment of all people in their jurisdictions and better
enabling to meet the basic needs of the community; and

 interest in the effective enforcement of state and local non-discrimination laws within their
