2 RESOLUTION NO. 2024-

3 A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION
4 OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA,
5 EXPRESSING SUPPORT OF FLORIDA HOUSE BILL 465
6 AND SENATE BILL 470, REGARDING POSTSECONDARY
7 EDUCATION STUDENTS, NOW BEING CONSIDERED IN THE
8 HIGHER EDUCATION APPROPRIATIONS SUBCOMMITTEE;
9 AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

11 **WHEREAS**, HB 465: Postsecondary Education Students introduced by Florida
12 House Representatives Garcia and Black would require as of July 1, 2024, public
13 postsecondary educational institutions to report certain student information to the U.S,
14 Department of Homeland Security and will require FCS institutions & state universities to
15 assess out-of-state fee for students who promote foreign terrorist organization; and
16 provides that students who promote foreign terrorist organization be ineligible for specific
17 fee waivers and any institutional or state grants, financial aid, scholarships, or tuition
18 assistance; and

19 **WHEREAS**, SB 470: Postsecondary Education Students introduced by Florida State
20 Senator Ingoglia, would require as of July 1, 2024, that public postsecondary educational
21 institutions report certain student information to the United States Department of Homeland
22 Security; and would require Florida College System institutions to assess the out-of-state
23 fee for students who promote a foreign terrorist organization; providing that students who
24 promote a foreign terrorist organization are ineligible for a fee waiver; providing that
25 students who promote a foreign terrorist organization are ineligible for any institutional or
26 state grants, financial aid, scholarships, or tuition assistance; and

27 **WHEREAS**, between October 7 and December 7, 2023, 2031 incidents of
28 antisemitism have been recorded, the highest ever two-month number recorded by the ADL
29 within the United States since 1979. This resulted in a 337 percent increase over the same
30 period in 2022; and

31 **WHEREAS**, under Florida law it is a felony to knowingly provide material support to
32 a designated foreign terrorist organization. There are active SJP chapters at two Florida

33 universities: the University of Florida and the University of South Florida. Under the
34 headship of the National Students for Justice in Palestine, a distributed toolkit identified
35 themselves as part of the Operation AlAqsa Flood [Hammas' name for their terrorist attacks
36 on Israel]; and

37 **WHEREAS**, there are active SJP chapters at two Florida schools: the University of
38 Florida and the University of South Florida; and

39 **WHEREAS**, Alan Dershowitz, a Harvard University Law School professor emeritus,
40 opined that a single standard must prevail on university campuses and that student groups
41 that support Hamas should be treated the way a student group that supported the Ku Klux
42 Klan or supported the rape of women, or the killing of gays should be treated; and

43 **WHEREAS**, SB 465 seeks to add to section 1009.23, Florida Statutes, to read:
44 1009.23 Florida College System institution student fees. - A student who promotes a
45 foreign terrorist organization during any term of his or her enrollment must be assessed the
46 out-of-state fee established in subsections (3) and (4) during that term and any subsequent
47 term of enrollment; and

48 **WHEREAS**, SB 465 is created to have Section 1009.8963, Florida Statutes, read:
49 Prohibition on awarding of scholarships, grants, and other aid.— A student who
50 organization during any term awarded any institutional or promotes a foreign terrorist of his
51 or her enrollment may not be state grants, financial aid; and

52 **WHEREAS**, on January 23, 2024, during a Students Supporting Israel rally devoted
53 to bring awareness to the Israeli hostages in Gaza, a 21-year-old student targeted SSI
54 students, threatening to “come back and shoot” the students hosting this UCF-approved
55 demonstration was arrested; and

56 **WHEREAS**, the City of Hallandale Beach Commission hereby expresses its
57 unwavering support of the passage of HB 465 and SB 470 and deems this legislation as
58 vital for the future safety and security of all Florida college and university students.

60 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COMMISSION**
61 **OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:**

62 **SECTION 1.** The foregoing Whereas clauses are incorporated herein.

64 **SECTION 2.** The City of Hallandale Beach Commission hereby expresses its
65 unwavering support of the passage of HB 465 and SB 470 and deems this legislation as vital
66 for the future safety and security of all Florida college and university students in light of the
67 337 percent increase in incidents of antisemitism and the events of January 23, 2024, during
68 a Students Supporting Israel rally devoted bring awareness to the Israeli hostages in Gaza,
69 wherein a 21-year-old student targeted SSI students, threatened to “come back and shoot”
70 the students hosting this UCF-approved demonstration.

72 **SECTION 3: Effective Date.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its
73 passage and adoption.
