SHORT TITLE:

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING USE OF CONTINUING SERVICE AGREEMENT TO RETAIN THE SERVICES OF R.J. BEHAR & COMPANY, INC. TO DESIGN THE REPLACEMENT OF THE 12-INCH WATERMAIN ON ATLANTIC SHORES BOULEVARD BETWEEN NE 14TH AVENUE AND THREE ISLAND BOULEVARD FOR AN AMOUNT NOT-TO-EXCEED ONE HUNDRED FORTY-ONE THOUSAND, ONE HUNDRED NINETEEN DOLLARS AND FORTY-NINE CENTS (\$141,119.49); AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO SIGN ALL OTHER RELATED DOCUMENTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

STAFF SUMMARY:

Summary:

This agenda item seeks City Commission's approval to retain the services of RJ Behar to design the replacement of an existing 12-inch watermain on Atlantic Shores Boulevard in accordance with RFP# FY2018-2019-012 – Continuing Professional Architectural and Engineering Services, for an amount not-to-exceed \$141,119.49. The above listed consultant will be providing services based on the following discipline: Civil Engineering. The opinion of probable cost of this project \$728,326.50 (Exhibit 2).

Background:

On August 5, 2020, the City Commission approved Resolution No. 2020-054 (Exhibit 3) authorizing continuing service agreements be awarded in accordance with the Consultant Competitive Negotiation Act (CCNA).

On February 16 and March 2, 2022, respectively, the City Commission approved the first and second readings of Ordinance No. 2022-004 amending the adopted budget for FY 2021/2022 to reflect the revenues, expenditures, appropriations, and other miscellaneous adjustments (Exhibit 4). The approved expenditures included in this budget amendment pertain to the design work to facilitate the initiation of multiple utility infrastructure projects. These projects are prioritized based on the recommendations outlined in the BODR (Basis of Design Report), Wastewater Masterplan, 10 Year Water Supply Plan and staff's recommendations based on need (Exhibit 5 – Project List)

The Public Works team continues to reassess the City's current infrastructure. Based on our findings during past and recent emergency responses to infrastructure failures, we need to initiate as many projects for design as possible to engage in an effective rehabilitation strategy for the City.

Current Situation:

The City has requested RJ Behar to provide civil engineering services associated with the replacement of the existing 12-inch cast iron (C.I.) watermain (built in 1969) with a new 12-inch watermain along Atlantic Shores Boulevard, between NE 14th Avenue and Three Islands Boulevard. The Atlantic Shores Boulevard Roadway Improvement Project (P1601) is currently under design. That project overlaps with the 12-inch watermain project between NE 14th Avenue to Diplomat Parkway. The intent is to have the waterline replaced ahead of the Atlantic Shores Boulevard Roadway Improvement Project (P1601) to prevent excavating through a newly restore roadway. The length of the new 12-inch watermain is approximately 2,600 feet.

RJ Behar has submitted the attached cost proposal (Exhibit 6) to perform the work described above for an amount not-to-exceed \$141,119.49. This is inclusive of all subconsultants, should they be utilized; and post design services which includes consulting services during the construction RFP process, and inspection services during construction.

Why Action is Necessary:

Pursuant to Chapter 23, Section 23-4, Competitive Bidding Required, all purchases of and contracts for equipment, supplies and contractual services, when the estimated cost shall exceed \$50,000.00 shall be based on competitive bids. Furthermore, pursuant to Chapter 23, Section 23-6, Award of Contract, the City Manager, shall have the authority to recommend to the City Commission award of contracts. Chapter 23, Section 23-8 (7) Continuing Services Agreements. Individual purchases for professional services not exceeding \$75,000 made pursuant to continuing services agreements resulting from a publicly solicited Request for Proposals may be approved by the City Manager.

Cost Benefit:

It is our objective to pursue alternative sources of funding for construction. For example, initiating the design of critical infrastructure projects now will allow for a more effective use of revenue bond proceeds for construction upon their disbursement. Furthermore, many grant opportunities require an applying municipality to have "shovel ready" projects to be considered for funding. The City has missed previous grant opportunities due to not having projects at this stage of readiness. The Public Works team is adapting to this dynamic and will move forward expeditiously to rehabilitate the City's infrastructure by accessing bond and grant funding.

PROPOSED ACTION:
