13	WHEREAS, the City of Hallandale Beach continues to be plagued with inordinate amounts		
14	of littering and illegal dumping on the public rights-or way and private properties; and		
15	WHEREAS, in the past five (5) months, the City's code enforcement cases related to		
16	illegal dumping increased to forty-eight percent (48%) of overall code cases; and		
17	WHEREAS, to facilitate the goal of reducing and abating illegal dumping and trash		
18	violations throughout the City, among other focused strategies, staff recommends amending city		
19	code section 13-36 (c), by re-categorizing illegal dumping into newly created code section 13-43		
20 21	and also reclassifying illegal dumping as a class IV civil violation subject to a five hundred dollar fine; and		
22	WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission have determined that the proposed		
23	amendments are in the best interest of the City of Hallandale Beach and its residents and hereby		
24	adopt this ordinance, amending section 13-36 and creating code section 13-43.

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28	SECTION 1: Chapter 13, Section 13-36, Article II of the City of Hallandale Beach's

30	Sec. 13-36. Accumulation or storage of junk.		
31	(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to cause or permit junk, scrap metal, scrap lumber,		
32	wastepaper products, discarded building materials, any unused abandoned vehicle, or		
33	abandoned vehicle parts, machinery or machinery parts, or other waste materials to be

- in or upon any yard, garden, lawn, outbuilding or premises in the city. Any business
 enterprise must obtain a special license or permit to store or stock any such items of
 this nature, the license or permit to show the items to be stored.
- (b) It shall be unlawful to permit any accumulation of any such waste materials to be in or
 upon any yard, lawn, garden, outbuilding or premises in the city if the accumulation
 constitutes a fire hazard, a hazard to the safety of persons or property, or an unsanitary
 condition.
- (c) It shall be unlawful for any person to discard or abandon any of the waste materials
 mentioned in subsection (a) of this section upon premises not owned or occupied by
 such person with or without the consent of the owner or the person occupying the
 premises.
- 45 **SECTION 2:** Section 13-43, Article II of the City of Hallandale Beach's Code of Ordinances

46 is hereby created and reads as follows:

47 Sec. 13-43. Illegal Dumping

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- <u>It shall be unlawful for any person or business to discard or abandon any of the waste</u>
 <u>materials listed in Sec. 13-36 (a) upon premises not owned or occupied by such person</u>
 or business with or without the consent of the owner or the person occupying the premises.

 - b) <u>Any business found in violation of this section may result in revocation of certificate</u> of use issuance pursuant to code section 32-19.

 result in revocation of certificate of use issuance pursuant to code section 32.19.
