4 A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION
5 OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA
6 URGING BROWARD COUNTY ANIMAL CARE AND
7 ADOPTION DIVISION TO ABANDON THE NEWLY
8 CREATED INTAKE POLICY REQUIRING MUNICIPALITIES
9 AND LAW ENFORCEMENT TO HOLD STRAY ANIMALS
10 FOR A TIME PERIOD OF 72 HOURS PRIOR TO
11 ACCEPTANCE BY THE COUNTY; AND PROVIDING AN
12 EFFECTIVE DATE.

14 **WHEREAS**, Law Enforcement Officers are often the last resort when responding
15 to an issue involving stray animals or animal endangerment; and

16 **WHEREAS**, in the past, such animals could be immediately turned over to the
17 Broward County Animal Care and Adoption Division; and

18 **WHEREAS**, the Broward County Animal Care and Adoption Division unilaterally
19 changed the intake policy to require municipalities including law enforcement and good
20 Samaritan residents to hold animals for 72 hours before being taken in by the County;
21 and

22 **WHEREAS**, most municipalities in Broward County do not have the resources or
23 capacity to hold and care for animals properly without diverting resources meant to
24 provide safety for residents; and

26 **WHEREAS**, the Mayor and City Commission believe that urging the Broward
27 County Animal Care and Adoption Division to abandon the 72-hour-hold requirement and
28 accept animals immediately is in the best interests of the residents and animals of the
29 City.
