STAFF SUMMARY:

Summary:

Seawall presentation covering enforcement and public education measures geared toward protecting seawall integrity.

Background:

The Sustainability and Flood Mitigation Board recommended a program for seawall awareness and compliance that the City Commission discussed at the April 6, 2022, meeting.

Current Situation:

City Codes are in place to ensure compliance with seawall regulations. However, no awareness program was created to educate citizens.

Why Action is Necessary:

The importance of seaside integrity cannot be understated. An awareness campaign educating property owners can only assist in compliance efforts. This in turn will protect waterside properties from harm that degraded seawalls would bring.

Cost Benefit:


The preservation of the City's coastline and waterside properties serves to protect and preserve the health, safety, and resiliency of the City. The Seawall Awareness and Compliance Program is a public outreach campaign that provides guidance to property owners on seawall maintenance, regulations, and enforcement. Educational materials to be distributed to waterfront property owners is estimated at \$3,500.


