

Enforcement & The Team

Enforcement

- Code Compliance & PD
 - Marine Patrol
 - Biannual Inspections
 - Additional Inspections scheduled if needed
- Code Compliance & DPW
 - Inland waterway erosion checks
 - Annual Inspections
 - Engineering to confirm possible erosion
- Developing New SOP to ensure timely adjudication and fine imposition
- Open cases brought to hearing within two months for Special Magistrate order
- Fines imposed if compliance not timely in accordance with code
