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3	ORDINANCE NO. 2016-

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 32, ZONING AND LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE, DIVISION 20, "TEMPORARY USES", INCREASING THE ANNUAL FREQUENCY WHICH THE CITY MAY GRANT TEMPORARY USE PERMITS FOR MULTIFAMILY, COMMERICAL, AND CIVIC ESTABLISHMENTS FROM FOUR TIMES ANNUALLY TO SIX TIMES ANNUALLY, AND INCREASING THE FREQUENCY WHICH THE CITY MAY GRANT SIDEWALK SALES PERMITS FROM TWICE ANNUALLY TO THREE TIMES ANNUALLY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, at City Commission Budget Workshop held on August 24, 2016, the City Commission requested that administration amend the Zoning and Land Development Code to increase the number of occurrences allowed by special event permit (temporary uses) at any given location per year; and

WHEREAS, currently, the definitions as well as the provisions of Division 20, Temporary Uses, need to be revised to allow additional temporary use permits to be issued in residential and non-residential areas per fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, City Administration has reviewed the current policies regarding Temporary Uses and recommends Chapter 32, Zoning and Land Development Code of the City of Hallandale Beach, Division 20, Temporary Uses should be amended to allow additional temporary use permits to be issued in residential and non-residential areas per fiscal year, while continuing to keep allowable temporary use permits in single family residences at the same frequency; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2-231 of the City's Code of Ordinances, on September 28, 2016, the Planning and Zoning Board reviewed this ordinance and made an advisory recommendation to the Mayor and City Commission to approve and adopt the amendments to Division 20, Temporary Uses; and

38	WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission have determined it is in the best interest of
39	the City that Chapter 32, Zoning and Land Development Code of the City of Hallandale Beach,
40	Division 20, Temporary Uses should be amended to allow additional temporary use permits to be
41	issued in residential and non-residential areas per fiscal year.
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44	NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF
45	HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:
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47	SECTION 1. Chapter 32, Zoning and Land Development Code of the City of Hallandale
48	Beach shall be amended Division 20, Temporary Uses, as follows:

DIVISION 20. TEMPORARY USES

Sec. 32-708. - Duration and frequency of permit.

- (a) No more than Each single family residence is limited to four (4) temporary use permits each fiscal year. per establishment shall be permitted within the fiscal year at the same location except for events specified in Sec. 32-702(b), sidewalk sales and properties zoned CF, PLAC, CR-A and Fashion Art & Design Overlay Districts.
- (b) Each temporary use permit shall be issued for a specific period of time not to exceed five (5) days or, in the case of a seasonal sale such as that of Christmas trees and pumpkins, thirty (30) days. A temporary use permit may be approved by the city manager for a period greater than five (5) days, but not in excess of thirty (30) days, upon finding that such increased duration will not adversely impact the city and that the conditions of section 32-705 have been met. Each multi-family, commercial, or civic establishment is limited to six (6) temporary use permits each fiscal year, except for recurring events specified in Sec. 32-702(b), sidewalk sales specified in Sec. 32-708(d), and properties zoned CF, OS, PLAC, CR-A, and the Fashion Art & Design Subistrict.
- (c) Sidewalk sales shall not be permitted within six months of each occurrence, and shall not last more than 72 hours. Each temporary use permit shall be issued for a specific period of time not to exceed five (5) days or, in the case of a seasonal sale such as that of Christmas trees and pumpkins, thirty (30) days. A temporary use permit may be approved by the city manager for a period greater than five (5) days, but not in excess of thirty (30) days, upon finding that such increased duration will not adversely impact the city and that the conditions of section 32-705 have been met.
- (d) <u>Sidewalk sales shall not be permitted within four (4) months of each occurrence, and shall not last more than seventy two (72) hours.</u>
- (e) The violation of any of the conditions of a temporary use permit shall be subject to immediate revocation of the permit. It shall be unlawful for any person to continue a

temporary use after the permit has expired or been revoked. The duration and frequency
of a temporary use permit and annual permits may be altered as determined by the city
manager.
SECTION 2. Conflict. All ordinances or portions of the Code of Ordinances of the City or
Hallandale Beach in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be repealed to the extension
of such conflict.
SECTION 3. Severability. Should any provision of this ordinance be declared by a cour
of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a
whole, or any part thereof, other that the part declared to be invalid.
SECTION 4. Codification. It is the intention of the Mayor and the City Commission that
the provisions of this ordinance be incorporated into the Code of Ordinances; to effect such
intention the words "ordinance" or "section" may be changed to other appropriate words.
SECTION 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption
on second reading.
