3	A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, URGING THE			
5	FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO ADOPT AN AMENDMENT TO			
6	SECTION 456.064 FLORIDA STATUTES PROHIBITING THE			
7 8	USE OF CONVERSION THERAPY ON MINORS AND COMMENDING THE CITY OF WILTON MANORS AND SIMILAR			
9	CITIES WHO HAVE ADOPTED ORDINANCES PROHIBITING			
LO	THE PRACTICE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.			
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L2	WHEREAS, Senator Jeff Clemens and Representative Richardson introduced bills in the			
L3	Florida Senate and House of Representatives which, if adopted, would have prohibited licensed			
L4	professional counselors, licensed under the provisions regulating the practice of medicine,			
L5	osteopathic medicine, psychology, clinical social work, marriage and family therapy, or menta			
L6	health counseling from practicing or performing conversion therapy with an individual who is			
L7	younger than the age of eighteen (18); and

L9	WHEREAS, both bills died in the Health policy committee and was never enacted; and

21	WHEREAS, the City of Wilton Manor adopted Ordinance No. 2016-009 amending Chapter			
22	12 of the Code of Ordinances to create Article IV, Sexual Orientation or Gender Identity Chang			
23	Efforts; and			
24				
25	WHEREAS, other cities around the State of Florida are adopting ordinances similar to the			
26	one adopted by Wilton Manor; and			
27				
28	WHEREAS, the City of Wilton Manor has assessed a penalty for the violation of their			
29	ordinance of two hundred (\$200.00) dollars for each day that a violation occurs; and			
30				
31	WHEREAS, the American Psychiatric Association previously published a position			
32	statement in December 1998 opposing any psychiatric treatment, including reparative or			
33	conversion therapy, which is based upon the assumption that homosexuality per se is a mental			
34	disorder or that a patient should change his or her homosexual orientation; and			

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35	WHEREAS, the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry published a		
36	statement in 2012, in its journal that "[g]iven that there is no evidence that efforts to alter sexual		
37	orientation are effective, beneficial or necessary, and the possibility that they carry the risk of		
38	significant harm, such interventions are contraindicated "; and		
39			
40	WHEREAS, at least six (6) other national organizations have asserted the position that		
41	sexual orientation change efforts, including reparative therapy or conversion therapy are not		
42	recommended and may be harmful; and		
43			
44	WHEREAS, the State of Florida has a compelling interest in protecting physical and		
45	psychological well-being of minors, including those who are members of the LGBTQ community,		
46	and in protecting these minors from exposure to serious harm caused by sexual orientation and		
47	gender identity change efforts; and		
48			
49	WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Mayor and City Commission to support future efforts of		
50	members of the State legislature who introduce bills to prohibit the practice of conversion therapy		
51	on minors and to commend the cities who have already taken action to prohibit such therapies.

53	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY		
54	COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:		
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56	<b>SECTION 1.</b> Support of prohibition. The Mayor and City Commission strongly urge		
57	the members of the state legislature to enact an amendment to Section 456.064 of the Florida		
58	Statutes to prohibit the use of Conversion Therapy on youths under the age of eighteen (18).		
59			
60	SECTION 2. Commendation to Cities. The Mayor and City Commission commend		
61	cities, such as Wilton Manors, for taking action and enacting ordinances which prohibit the use of		
62	conversion therapy on minors in their cities.		
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64	SECTION 3. Direction to Clerk. The City Clerk is directed to distribute a copy of this		
65	resolution on the Broward County state legislative delegation and the cities of Broward County.		
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67	<b>SECTION 4.</b> That this resolution shall be in f	ull force and effect immediately upon its			
68	passage and adoption.
