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17	WHEREAS, at City Commission Budget Workshop held on August 24, 2016, the City
18	Commission requested that administration amend the Zoning and Land Development Code to
19	increase the number of occurrences allowed by special event permit (temporary uses) at any
20	given location per year; and
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22	WHEREAS, currently, the definitions as well as the provisions of Division 20, Temporary
23	Uses, need to be revised to allow additional temporary use permits to be issued in residential and
24	non-residential areas per fiscal year; and
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26	WHEREAS, the City Administration has reviewed the current policies regarding
27	Temporary Uses and recommends Chapter 32, Zoning and Land Development Code of the City
28	of Hallandale Beach, Division 20, Temporary Uses should be amended to allow additional
29	temporary use permits to be issued in residential and non-residential areas per fiscal year, while
30	continuing to keep allowable temporary use permits in single family residences at the same
31	frequency; and
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33	WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2-231 of the City's Code of Ordinances, on September
34	28, 2016, the Planning and Zoning Board reviewed this ordinance and made an advisory
35	recommendation to the Mayor and City Commission to approve and adopt the amendments to
36	Division 20, Temporary Uses; and
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38	WHEREAS, first reading took place on December 21 st , 2016, and the Commission moved
39	to change the sidewalk sale frequency from two times annually to six times annually; and
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41	WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission have determined it is in the best interest of
42	the City that Chapter 32, Zoning and Land Development Code of the City of Hallandale Beach,
43	Division 20, <i>Temporary Uses</i> should be amended to allow additional temporary use permits to be
44	issued in residential and non-residential areas per fiscal year.
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47	NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF

81	temporary use after the permit has expired or been revoked. The duration and frequency
82	of a temporary use permit and annual permits may be altered as determined by the city
83	manager.

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85 **SECTION 2. Conflict.** All ordinances or portions of the Code of Ordinances of the City of 86 Hallandale Beach in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be repealed to the extent 87 of such conflict.

88 **SECTION 3. Severability.** Should any provision of this ordinance be declared by a court 89 of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a 90 whole, or any part thereof, other that the part declared to be invalid.

91 **SECTION 4. Codification.** It is the intention of the Mayor and the City Commission that 92 the provisions of this ordinance be incorporated into the Code of Ordinances; to effect such 93 intention the words "ordinance" or "section" may be changed to other appropriate words.

94 <u>SECTION 5. Effective Date.</u> This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption
95 on second reading.
