A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, ADOPTING THE CITY'S 2017 LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES TO BE PRESENTED TO THE BROWARD COUNTY STATE LEGISLATIVE DELEGATION FOR CONSIDERATION DURING THE 2017 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Staff Summary:

BACKGROUND:

This item seeks City Commission adoption of the City's 2017 Legislative Priorities to be presented to the Broward County State Legislative Delegation for consideration during the 2017 Legislative Session.

The Legislative Priorities document (Exhibit 2) was discussed during the December 19, 2016 City Commission Workshop. There was consensus on the document, with the following additions:

- ✚ **SUPPORT** Legislation that will preserve the rights of condominium unit owners who might be forced to sell their units pursuant to a condominium termination plan;
- ✚ **SUPPORT** Legislation that will allow cities to consider and implement strategies to reduce the use of carryout plastic bags from grocery stores and other retail outlets;
- ✚ **SUPPORT** Legislation that will allow cities to consider and implement strategies to reduce the use of polystyrene products;
- ✚ **SUPPORT** Legislation that will provide funding for resiliency projects, including but not limited to, the recommendations of the Southeast Florida Coastal Ocean Task Force and environmentally responsible storm water treatment through conservation easements;
- ✚ **SUPPORT** legislation that will approve funding assistance to bury power lines;
- ✚ **SUPPORT** legislation related to flood control and mitigation assistance, including funding for maintenance of the C-51 Canal;
- ✚ **SUPPORT** legislation that will approve funding for bricks and mortar projects in public schools;
- ✚ **MONITOR** all Gaming legislation related to decoupling and portability;
- ✚ **MONITOR** legislation related to Community Redevelopment Agencies; and,
- ✚ **MONITOR** process and agendas related to the Florida Constitution Revision Commission.

The document has been revised accordingly.

WHY THIS ACTION IS NECESSARY:

Action by the City Commission will result in the adoption of the City's State Legislative Program. The Legislative Program prioritizes the City's legislative issues to be presented and proposed to the State legislature during the 2017 Legislative Session. Additionally, the Plan serves to guide City Commissioners, City Staff, the City's lobbyist, and the City's Legislators in pursuing legislative and other related actions of importance to the City.
