4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16	A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, ENDORSING THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE SOUTHEAST FLORIDA COASTAL OCEAN TASK FORCE (COTF); URGING OTHER LOCAL MUNICIPALITIES TO ENDORSE AND SUPPORT THE COTF RECOMMENDATIONS; EXPRESSING APPRECIATION FOR THE WORK OF MEMBERS OF THE COTF PROVIDING FOR DISTRIBUTION OF CERTIFIED COPIES OF THE APPROVED RESOLUTION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
17	WHEREAS, the Southeast Florida Coastal Ocean Task Force ("COTF") was
18 19	created in June, 2012 by the joint actions of Martin, Palm Beach, Broward, and Miami-
20	Dade counties; and

22	WHEREAS, the COTF was comprised of elected officials from Martin, Palm
23	Beach, Broward, and Miami-Dade counties; coastal municipalities within those counties,
24	and stakeholder representatives from non-governmental organizations, academia, the
25	marine industry, government environmental agencies, and fishing and diving
26	stakeholders; and
27 28 29 30	WHEREAS, the COTF was created for the purpose of developing conservation and management strategies for the coastal ocean waters of southeast Florida; and
31	WHEREAS, the COTF convened monthly over a period of thirty (30) months to be
32	further educated on threats to the coastal environment and develop recommendations for
33 34	regionally-coordinated conservation strategies; and
35	WHEREAS, southeast Florida has long depended upon coastal ocean waters for
36 37	recreation, fishing, and commerce; and
38	WHEREAS, these coastal waters and the resources they support are essential to
39	the economy of southeast Florida; and
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41	WHEREAS, it has been scientifically demonstrated that coastal ocean waters are		
42	under great user pressure and suffer from water quality degradation from human inputs		
43	and climate change impacts; and		
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45	WHEREAS, since, 2004, collaborative, multiagency conservation planning		
46	activities have been underway for the coral reefs of southeast Florida through the		
47	Southeast Florida Coral Reef Initiative ("SEFCRI"); and		
48			
49	WHEREAS, the COTF has worked in concert with SEFCRI and has given		
50	significant consideration to the previous efforts and recommendations reflected in		
51	SEFCRI's work products; and		
52			
53	WHEREAS, the COTF has finalized its recommendations as part of the Southeast		
54	Florida Coastal Ocean Task Force Final Recommendations Report (COTF Final Report),		
55	attached hereto as Exhibit "A"; and		
56			
57	WHEREAS, the COTF Final Report includes three (3) overarching		
58	recommendations relating to interagency coordination, implementation, and protection of		
59	coastal resources from any oil exploration off the Florida coast, with additional		
60	recommendations focusing on water quality, beaches, fisheries, coral reefs, estuaries,		
61	socioeconomics, the management of marine debris, and implementation strategies		
62	involving technical investigations, policy, planning, and projects; and		
63			
64	WHEREAS, The COTF Final Report will be presented for approval and		
65	advancement by the various convening bodies and all local governments within the 4-		
66	County planning area as viable and worthy goals for the conservation of southeast		
67	Florida's coastal waters.		
68			
69	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY		
70	COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:		
71 72	SECTION 1. The Mayor and City Commission endorses the Southeast Florida		

73	Coastal Ocean Task Force (COTF) Final Report and commits, within budgetary restraints,		
74	to work together in good faith with local, regional, state, and federal governments,		
75	educational institutions, and non-profit organizations to improve the coastal ecosystem in		
76	the region to benefit human use, ecosystem health, and economic sustainability.		
77			
78	SECTION 2. The City urges all local municipalities to pass a resolution stating		
79	their commitment to support the COTF Final Report and to work cooperatively to improve		
80	the coastal ecosystem by:		
81			
82	(a) Collectively advocating at the state and federal levels for funding for the listed		
83	goals and actions;		
84	(b) Partnering with other entities within the COTF region on agency or other grant		
85	and funding opportunities to advance the listed recommendations;		
86	(c) Collaborating on meaningful education and outreach programs to inform		
87	citizens on threats to the coastal ecosystem;		
88	(d) Working to implement projects identified within the COTF Final Report to move		
89	the region closer to achieving the goals set out by the COTF; and		
90	(e) Providing dedicated staff support and time to coordinate these efforts and		
91	projects within the region, as appropriate.		
92			
93	SECTION 3. The City here hereby expresses its appreciation for the work and		
94	efforts of COTF members and their alternates.		
95			
96	SECTION 4. The City requests that certified copies of this Resolution be		
97	distributed to Martin, Palm Beach, Miami-Dade, and Monroe counties, the Broward County		
98	League of Cities, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, and the Florida Fish		
99	and Wildlife Conservation Commission.

101	SECTION 5. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon		
102	its passage and adoption.
