3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17 18 19 20	A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, IN SUPPORT OF SENATE BILL 650 AND HOUSE BILL 669 RELATING TO RETAIL ESTABLISHMENTS AND SHOPPING CENTERS; REQUIRING CERTAIN PARKING LOTS TO CONTAIN A MINIMUM AMOUNT OF PARKING SPACES DESIGNATED FOR EXPECTANT MOTHERS, SUBJECT TO CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS; REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO ESTABLISH REQUIREMENTS FOR SIGNAGE AND MARKINGS FOR SUCH PARKING SPACES; REQUIRING CERTAIN RETAIL ESTABLISHMENTS AND SHOPPING CENTERS TO PROVIDE AND MAINTAIN BREASTFEEDING AREAS; DEFINING THE TERM "BREASTFEEDING AREA"; AND, PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
21	WHEREAS, at the present time, expectant mothers have few options to park their
22	vehicles in parking lot spaces other than those reserved for the general public; and
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24	WHEREAS, a pregnant woman may obtain a handicapped parking permit only if
25	she has a disability certified by a physician; and
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27	WHEREAS, some parking lot owners have added expectant mother parking
2829	spaces for the convenience of their customers; and
30	WHEREAS, these parking spaces are voluntary and are not subject to the same
31 32	standards as handicapped parking spaces; and
33	WHEREAS, Senate Bill 650 and House Bill 669 would require certain parking lots
34	to contain a minimum amount of parking spaces designated for use by expectant mothers,
35	subject to certain requirements established by the Department of Transportation; and
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37	WHEREAS, the parking lot of a retail establishment or shopping center which
38	contains more than 100 parking spaces would include at least 1 parking space that is
39	designated for use by expectant mothers; and
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42	WHEREAS, such parking space must be located as closely as possible to parking
43	spaces designated for use by persons with disabilities; however, the location of parking
44	spaces designated for use by persons with disabilities shall take precedence; and
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46	WHEREAS, the breastfeeding of a baby is an important and basic act of nurture
47	which must be encouraged in the interests of maternal and child health and family values;
48	and

50	WHEREAS, the proposed legislation would require certain retail establishments
51	and shopping centers to provide and maintain breastfeeding areas; and
52	
53	WHEREAS, a retail establishment or shopping center having a parking lot
54	containing more than 100 parking spaces would be required to provide and maintain a
55	breastfeeding area located in such establishment or center; and
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57	WHEREAS, the term "breastfeeding area" means a room or location in a retail
58	establishment or shopping center which provides a location shielded from view and free
59	from intrusion by the public where a woman may breastfeed or express breast milk; and
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61	WHEREAS, the breastfeeding area must have a door that can be locked; includes
62	a place to sit; is readily accessible to and usable by persons with disabilities, including
63	persons who use wheelchairs, as required under the Americans with Disabilities Act of
64	1990; and is not located in a restroom or dressing room.
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66	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY
67	COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:
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69	SECTION 1. Support of Senate Bill 650 and House Bill 669. The Mayor and
70	City Commission hereby support Senate Bill 650 and House Bill 669, relating to requiring
71	certain parking lots to contain parking spaces designated for use by expectant mothers in
72	retail establishments and shopping centers; and, requiring certain retail establishments
73	and shopping centers to provide and maintain breastfeeding areas.

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75	SECTION 2. Directions to City Manager and City Clerk. The Mayor and City
76	Commission direct the City Manager to take all necessary steps to effectuate this
77	resolution and direct the Clerk to cause a copy of this resolution to be forwarded to all
78	appropriate parties.
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80	SECTION 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon
81	its passage and adoption.
