4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15	A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, IN SUPPORT OF SENATE BILL 10 AND HOUSE BILL 761, THE COAST TO COAST COMPREHENSIVE WATER RESOURCE PROGRAM, RELATING TO THE EVERGLADES AGRICULTURAL AREA RESEVOIR PROJECT, INCREASING WATER ACCESS TO THE EVERGLADES AND FLORIDA BAY AND PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS WATER RELATED PROJECTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.		
16	WHEREAS, since the 2000 inception of the Comprehensive Everglades		
17	Restoration Plan (CERP), there has been broad consensus that southern storage		
18	represents an essential component to address the two-pronged issue of alleviating		
19	discharges to the coasts and rehydrating the Everglades; and		
20			
21	WHEREAS, Senate Bill (SB) 10, also known as the Coast to Coast		
22	Comprehensive Water Resource Program, and House Bill (HB) 761 address the need for		
23	water storage south of Lake Okeechobee to reduce harmful discharges from Lake		
24	Okeechobee, which have flooded communities on the St. Lucie and Caloosahatchee		
25	Rivers with massive amounts of toxic algae that destroyed estuaries and harmed the local		
26	and state economies; and		
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28	WHEREAS, SB 10 is expected to provide 120 billion gallons of extra storage and		
29	treatment, addressing both needs for a dramatic increase of water moving south to the		
30	Everglades and Florida Bay and a dramatic decrease in discharges to the St. Lucie and		
31	Caloosahatchee estuaries, by close to fifty (50%) percent; and		
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33	WHEREAS, the proposed legislation would accelerate the timing and funding for		
34	the state share of the Everglades Agricultural Area Reservoir Project. The bill directs the		
35	South Florida Water Management District to seek out willing sellers of land within the area		
36 37	suitable for the construction of a southern above ground reservoir with a total water capacity of three hundred sixty thousand (360,000) acre-feet; and		

38 WHEREAS, a study from Clemson University and the Everglades Foundation 39 showed that the Reservoir Project south of Lake Okeechobee would generate more than 40 thirty nine thousand (39,000) jobs and provide a \$20 billion economic benefit – an 8-to-1 41 return on investment; and 42 43 **WHEREAS**, the proposed legislation includes funding for water related projects 44 affecting the St. Johns River, the Indian River Lagoon and the Keys, deals with wastewater 45 issues, asks for improvements to the Herbert Hoover Dike and even provides for displaced 46 farmers; and 47 48 **WHEREAS**, the proposed legislation would also provide funding to aggressively 49 address the retrofitting or conversion to central sewer systems of outdated septic systems; 50 and 51 52 WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission urge the Florida Legislature to 53 support and advance SB 10 and HB 761 for the economic and environmental benefit of 54 all Floridians. 55 56 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY 57 COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA: 58 59 **SECTION 1.** The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are incorporated fully herein. 60 61 SECTION 2. Support of Senate Bill 10 and House Bill 761. The Mayor and City 62 Commission hereby support Senate Bill 10 and House Bill 761, the Coast to Coast Water 63 Resource Comprehensive Program, relating to the Everglades Agricultural Area Reservoir 64 Project, increasing water access to the Everglades and Florida Bay, and providing for 65 various water resources improvement projects for the economic and environmental benefit 66 of all Floridians. 67 68 **SECTION 3.** Directions to City Manager and City Clerk. The Mayor and City 69 Commission direct the City Manager to take all necessary steps to effectuate this 70 resolution and direct the Clerk to cause a copy of this resolution to be forwarded to all 71 appropriate parties.
