5	A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF		
6 7	THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, URGING THE		
8	FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO OPPOSE SENATE BILL 1770 AND		
9 10	HOUSE BILL 13 WHICH PHASE OUT COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCIES AND WOULD NOT ALLOW ANY		
11	NEW CRA PROJECTS OR DEBT AFTER OCTOBER 1, 2017;		
12 13	PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.		
13 14	WHEREAS, Part III of Chapter 163, Florida Statutes, currently allows a county or		
15	municipality to create a Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) to carry out		
16	redevelopment of slum or blighted areas when certain conditions exist. Examples of		
17	conditions that can support the creation of a CRA include the presence of substandard or		
18	inadequate structures, a shortage of affordable housing, inadequate infrastructure and		
19	insufficient roadways; and		
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21	WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature is considering House Bill (HB) 13, which will		
22	terminate all CRAs in the state by 2037, not allow the creation of any new CRAs after		
23	October 1, 2017, and not allow any new CRA projects or debt after October 1, 2017; and		
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25	WHEREAS, Senate Bill (SB) 1770 will terminate all CRAs in the state by 2037 and		
26	will only allow the creation of new CRAs by a super majority vote of a city or county; and		
27			
28	WHEREAS, CRAs have demonstrated that the use of Tax Increment Funding		
29	dramatically improved the economic and social outcomes within the targeted areas. These		
30	outcomes benefit both cities and the counties and, more importantly, the taxpayers; and		
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32	WHEREAS, CRAs have proven historically to provide distressed communities with		
33	a better economy through improved infrastructure, job opportunities and housing. Their		
34	mission is to make housing and urban areas safer for residents, to preserve and grow		
35	business, and provide a sense of place for all who live there; and

	WHEREAS , the Hallandale Beach Community Redevelopment Agency (HBCRA)

39 eliminating and preventing blighted conditions through the facilitation of community 40 partnerships, business growth, job creation and neighborhood revitalization; and

42 WHEREAS, during its tenure the HBCRA has executed various successful programs and initiatives aimed at addressing slum and blight, reducing crime, construction 43 44 of new affordable housing, stimulating job creation, and building needed infrastructure in 45 our neighborhoods; and

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47 **WHEREAS**, 10 years remain in the service life of the HBCRA and the agency plans to pursue new projects and further the progress it has achieved in the local community; 48 49 and

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51 WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission support the ability of local 52 governments to create and effectively use CRAs to redevelop and revitalize their urban 53 areas; and

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55 WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission have determined that the residents 56 and public should strongly urge the Florida Legislature to oppose SB 1770 and HB 13 which would phase-out CRAs and prevent the HBCRA from pursuing any new projects 57 after October 1, 2017. 58

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA: 61

SECTION 1. All the foregoing "Whereas" clauses are incorporated fully herein.

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SECTION 2. Opposing Senate Bill 1770 and House Bill 13. The Mayor and 65 City Commission of the City of Hallandale Beach strongly urge the Florida Legislature to 66 oppose Senate Bill 1770 and House Bill 13 which would phase-out CRAs and prevent 67 68 existing CRAs from commencing any new projects after October 1, 2017.

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70 SECTION 3. Directions to City Manager. The Mayor and City Commission 71 direct the City Manager to cause a copy of this resolution to be forwarded to all appropriate 72 parties.
