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21 **WHEREAS,** pursuant to the City of Hallandale Beach Code of Ordinances,
22 Chapter 23, Section 23-4, Competitive Bidding required, all purchases of and contracts
23 for equipment, supplies, and contractual services, when the estimated cost shall exceed
24 \$50,000, shall be based on competitive bids. Furthermore, pursuant to Chapter 23,
25 Section 23-6 Award of Contract, City Manager shall have the authority to recommend to
26 the City Commission award of contracts; and
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28 **WHEREAS,** as a result of concerns raised about insufficient parking city-wide, and
29 limited payment options when using the pay stations at both North and South Beach Parks
30 parking facilities, the City released an Request for Proposal (RFP) for a company that
31 would partner with the City to provide first class parking program for residents and visitors;
32 and
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34 **WHEREAS,** the parking requirements for mid and high-rise condominium built in
35 the 1950's and 1960's were significantly different and required fewer parking spaces than
36 modern buildings today; and
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38 **WHEREAS,** according to the 2010 Census, the median age in Hallandale Beach
39 is down to 49, and this shift to a younger population also impacts the number of drivers in
40 the average household, hence increasing the number of cars in the household; and

41 **WHEREAS**, on April 22, 2016, the City released RFP #FY2015-2016-016, Parking
42 Management Services; and

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44 **WHEREAS**, on May 13, 2016, a non-mandatory pre-bid conference was held, and
45 on June 2, 2016, the deadline for sealed bid submission, and two (2) vendors submitted
46 proposals; and

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48 **WHEREAS**, staff evaluated the responses from the two (2) proposals received,
49 and selected SP + Municipal Services as the highest ranked proposal; and

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51 **WHEREAS**, the City Administration recommends awarding RFP FY#2015-2016-
52 016, Parking Management Services to the highest ranked proposal, SP + Municipal
53 Services in the amount not to exceed two hundred thousand (\$200,000.00) dollars for
54 management of all on and off-street parking assets, including parking enforcement, meter
55 maintenance, and revenue collections, further authorizing the City Manager and City
56 Attorney to negotiate with the succeeding ranked firm should negotiations with SP +
57 Municipal Services not be successful; and

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59 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY**
60 **COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:**

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62 **SECTION 1. City Commission Award.** The Mayor and City Commission award
63 Bid #FY 2015-2016-016 to SP + Municipal Services, for an amount not to exceed two
64 hundred thousand (\$200,000.00) dollars.

65 **SECTION 2. City Manager Authorization.** The Mayor and City Commission
66 hereby authorize the City Manager and City Attorney to negotiate an agreement with SP
67 + Municipal Services for an amount not to exceed two hundred thousand (\$200,000.00)
68 dollars for management of all on and off-street parking assets, including parking
69 enforcement, meter maintenance, and revenue collections). Further authorizing the City
70 Manager and City Attorney to negotiate with the succeeding ranked firm should
71 negotiations with SP + Municipal Services not be successful.

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73 **SECTION 3. Effective Date.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon
74 its passage and adoption.

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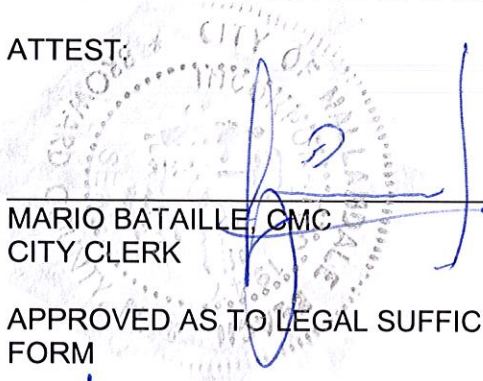

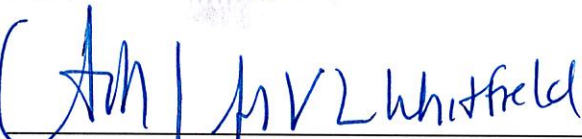
