6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14	THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, SUPPORTING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESSIONAL BILLS S. 279 AND H.R. 833 TO AMEND SECTION 935 OF THE WATER RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT ACT OF 1986 TO FACILITATE THE USE OF FOREIGN OFFSHORE SAND IN BEACH RENOURISHMENT PROJECTS; URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO EXPEDITE AND FUND THE STUDY TO ALLOW FOREIGN SAND TO BE USED IN BEACH RENOURISHMENT PROJECTS IN SOUTH FLORIDA; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.		
15 16	WHEREAS, beaches and dunes serve as a vital buffer between coastal infrastructure		
17	and the destructive forces of ocean waves and surge during storm events; and		
18 19	WHEREAS, beach renourishment adds sand to coastal system, helps keep the erosive		
20	power of strong waves from reaching dunes and structures, and buffers against the effect of		
21	sea level rise and climate change, thereby protecting coastal properties and the coastal		
22	environment; and		
23			
24	WHEREAS, beach renourishment has been an ongoing practice in southeast Florida		
25	since the late 1970's providing essential economic, environmental and recreational benefit to		
26	coastal communities; and		
27 28	WHEREAS, throughout the region, twenty-four (24) federal and nonfederal beach		
29	renourishment projects provide storm damage reduction to infrastructure as well as incidental		
30	recreational opportunities; and		
31 32	WHEREAS, South Florida is running out of dependable, economical, and		
33	environmentally practicable sand sources; and		
34 35	WHEREAS, Section 935 of the Water Resources Development Act of 1986 ("WRDA		
36	1986") states that the Army Corps can only use domestic sources of sand for renourishment		
37	projects, unless the Secretary of the Army provides written certification that domestic sources		
38	are not available for environmental or economic reasons; and

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1	WHEREAS, in March, 2016, the Army Corps completed a Limited Reevaluation Report		
2	and Environmental Assessment with Finding of No Significant Impact with updated economic		
3	to justify potential alternative sand sources for future renourishment projects to utilize new sand		
4	sources, which include Bahamas sand; and		
5			
6	WHEREAS, the option to import offshore sand from the Bahamas to expedite beach		
7	renourishment projects in South Florida is important because the sand may be closer to the		
8	quality of the sand the City's beaches than some of the alternatives listed by the Army Corps		
9	and		
10 11	WHEREAS, foreign offshore sources may have a lower cost to import than purchasing		
12	sand from approved upland sources, and there may be fewer impacts on roads, such as		
13	reduced quality of life impacts resulting from truck traffic and fewer carbon emission from trucks		
14	hauling the sand; and		
15			
16	WHEREAS, the City of Hallandale Beach supports a recent decision by the federa		
17	government to study the benefits of replenishing Florida beaches with foreign sand; and		
18 19	WHEREAS, on February 2, 2017, United States Senator, Marco Rubio introduced S.		
20	279, and Unites States Congresswoman, Lois Frankel introduced companion bill H.R. 833 to		
21	amend the WRDA 1986 with respect to the acquisition of beach fill to eliminate the restriction		
22	against offshore sand; and		
23			
24	WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City of Hallandale Beach to support S. 279		
25	and H.R. 833 to eliminate the restriction against offshore sand, and to urge the United States		
26	Congress to expedite and fund the study to evaluate the benefits of replenishing Florida		
27	beaches with foreign land.

30	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY		
31	COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:

33	SECTION 1. The foregoing "whereas" clauses are confirmed as true and adopted		
34	herein.		
35	SECTION 2. Supporting S. 279 and H.R. 833. The Mayor and City Commission of		
36	the City of Hallandale Beach strongly supports United States Congressional Bills S. 279 and		

1	H.R. 833 to amend the Water Resources Development Act of 1986 and urges the members of			
2	the Florida Congressional Delegation to expedite efforts to allow foreign sources of sand be			
3	utilized in Beach Renourishment Projects in South Florida. The Mayor and City Commission			
4	urges the United States Congress to expedite and fund the study to evaluate the benefits of			
5	replenishing Florida beaches with foreign sand.

7	SECTION 3. Directions to City Manag	er. The Mayor and City Commission direct the		
8	City Manager to cause a copy of this resolution to	o be forwarded to all appropriate parties.
