10	WHEREAS, Senator Bill Nelson reintroduced bill s. 606 that hits close to an issue		
18	that greatly affects the State of Florida, the Identity Theft and Tax Fraud Prevention Act of		
19	2017; and

21	WHEREAS, South Florida ranks among the top metropolitan areas for identify theft		
22	complaints, according to data released earlier by the Federal Trade Commission; and		
23			
24	WHEREAS, the Florida legislation seeks to deter criminals who commit tax fraud		
25	using a stolen identity by increasing penalties on both identity thieves, and on paid tax		
26	preparers; and		
27			
28	WHEREAS, these fraudsters are costing tax payers hundreds of millions of dollars		
29	every year; and		
30			
31	WHEREAS, this bill would help crack down on thieves, while also making it easier		
32	for those whose identifies are stolen to get the refunds they're owed; and		
33			
34	WHEREAS, the bill's intent is to develop and implement publicly available		
35	guidelines for management of cases involving stolen identity refund fraud in a manner that		
36	reduces the administrative burden on taxpayers who are victims of such fraud; and		

37 WHEREAS, the bill would increase the maximum fine criminals could face for filing 38 a fraudulent tax return with someone else's identity from one hundred thousand (\$100,00.00) dollars to two hundred fifty thousand (\$250,000.00) dollars; and 39 40 41 WHEREAS, the bill would also increase the penalty for tax preparers who fail to protect their clients' information from two hundred fifty (\$250.00) dollars per incident to 42 43 one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars; and 44 WHEREAS, to speed up the time it takes the IRS to resolve these types of claims, 45 Sen. Nelson's bill would require the agency to create and implement a more streamlined 46 process for handling ID theft cases; and 47 48 49 WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission strongly support United States 50 Senator Bill Nelson's bill s. 606, Identity Theft and Tax Fraud Prevention Act of 2017 to combat ID theft related tax fraud. 51 52 53 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY 54 COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA: 55 56 **SECTION 1.** The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are incorporated fully herein. 57 SECTION 2. Support of U.S. Senator Bill Nelson S. 606 ID Theft and Tax Fraud 58 Prevention Act of 2017. The Mayor and City Commission hereby support Senator Bill 59 Nelson's bill s. 606 Identity Theft and Tax Fraud Prevention Act of 2017 to combat ID theft 60 related tax fraud by increasing the maximum fine criminals face for filing a fraudulent tax 61 62 return with someone else's identity, and increasing the penalty for tax preparers who fail 63 to protect their client's information. 64 SECTION 3. Directions to City Manager and City Clerk. The Mayor and City 65 Commission direct the City Manager to take all necessary steps to effectuate this 66 67 resolution and direct the Clerk to cause a copy of this resolution to be forwarded to all 68 appropriate parties. 69
