Returned Funds & Additional Audit Costs

- > \$25,000 returned due to non-compliance and unallowable expenditures
- > \$7,000 spent in additional audit costs due to omission of FDOT grant on year-end audit schedules
- > \$7,000 spent on special audit at the request of granting agency (DOJ)
