Short Title:

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION EXPRESSING ITS SUPPORT FOR THE BROWARD COUNTY CHIEFS OF POLICE ASSOCIATION AND URGING THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROWARD COUNTY TO INCREASE THE CURRENT FUNDING ALLOCATED FOR SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS FROM \$46,252 TO \$56,252 PER OFFICE FOR ALL PARTICIPATING AGENCIES; PROVIDING FOR DISTRIBUTION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Staff Summary:

Background:

Mayor Cooper requested a Item for consideration by the City Commission expressing support for the Broward County Chiefs of Police Association and urges that the Broward County School Board increase the current funding allocated for SROs from \$46,252 to \$56,252 per officer for all participating agencies.

The current Broward County School Board contribution to the SRO's salary represents approximately 30-40% (depending on the agency's benefits) of the total cost for employing these officers. The deployment of the SROs provides a tremendous savings to the Broward County School Board and creates a financial burden on the local participating agencies where the allocated amount per SRO has not changed since the conclusion of the 2011 contract cycle and has not been adjusted to cover the present costs of employing a law enforcement officer in Broward County schools.

Currently the City of Hallandale Beach receives \$185,008 to provide four school resource officers to the local public schools. Therefore it is in the best intrest of the City to support the Broward County Chiefs of Police position urging the School Board of Borward County to increase the current allocated funding for School Resource Officer.

Why Action is Necessary:

Pursuant to Article V, Section 5.01 of the City of Hallandale Beach Charter, a Resolution adopted by the Commission is an expression of the Commission on matters of official concern and opinion.

Fiscal Impact:

There is no fiscal impact.

Proposed Action:
