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SECTION 2. The Commission may amend, by motion, the budget as it deems necessary.

The budget as originally proposed is amended as follows:

- a. As an alternative to the sale of the solid waste commercial and multi-family franchise, the rates for services will be increased for these customers to make up the lost revenue from the sale of the franchise and additional funds to make the solid waste budget, including the single family homes (fees already proposed to increase) sustainable. The proposed additional rate increase for FY 2017/18 is 30 percent for multifamily and commercial. This calculation is spread across many variables depending on the volume of solid waste produced and the frequency of collection.
- b. The number of body worn cameras will be reduced to 100 from the 200 proposed. The \$100,000 savings from the first-year lease payments and \$500,000 from fund balance

- reserves will be added to the employees' Health Reimbursement Account (HRA). Fund described in letter c. below.
 - c. To further mitigate the health insurance high deductible transition, \$600,000 will be added to the HRA fund to help reduce the impact of the City's newly implemented high deductible plan.
 - d. The budget ordinance establishes a utilization of reserves policy that sets a floor for reserves in the major funds as follows:

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- Reserve levels can be drawn down below the levels shown above during an emergency situation or pursuant to a public hearing. This will only be in effect for FY 2017/18 and during the year, a long-term reserve policy will be presented for adoption.
- e. \$7,500 will be provided to match the grant from Kaufman Lynn for youth programs to be determined by the Parks and Recreation Department.
 - f. \$20,000 will be provided to the Police Department for safety-related equipment predominantly for the SWAT Officers. The estimated cost for this equipment is \$87,000 which will be funded from the \$20,000, grants and other existing funds.
 - g. The Hallandale Beach Community Redevelopment Agency (HBCRA) contribution to the local match for the SW Drainage Project will continue to be replaced with the increased charges from the Stormwater Fund. If additional funds beyond the current projected local share are needed, those funds will come from the HBCRA through a budget amendment process after the bids are received.

- **SECTION 3.** In an effort to insure regularity and to better control expenses, the following budget appropriations are to be included Fiscal Year 2017/18:
 - a. Re-appropriations of Fiscal Year 2016/17 unspent funds into Fiscal Year 2017/18 are as follows:

- b. The City Commission authorizes the utilization of \$500,000 from fund balance to fund the HRA (see Section 2b) and to balance Law Enforcement Trust and Police Equitable Sharing Funds, where necessary since the dollars to be received from the State are not budgeted.
- c. The City Commission authorizes the re-appropriation of \$1,278,924 to balance the General Fund and \$100,000 for the HRA (see Section 2b above) from the Fiscal Year 2016/17 Budget, Camera project.

SECTION 4. That when the City of Hallandale Beach receives monies from any source, be it private or governmental, by grant, gift, or otherwise, to which there is attached as a condition of acceptance, any limitation regarding the use or expenditure of the monies received, the funds so

received need not be shown in the Annual Budget nor shall said budget be subject to amendment or expenditure as a result of the receipt of said monies, but said monies shall only be disbursed and applied toward the purposes for which the said funds were received. To ensure the integrity of the Operating Budget, and the integrity of the monies received by the City under grants or gifts, all monies received as contemplated above must, upon receipt, be segregated and accounted for based upon generally accepted accounting principles and placed into separate revenue and expenditure accounts established to properly account for all such funds and expenditures. Any money drawn from the established expenditure accounts may only be disbursed and applied within the limitations placed upon the gift or grant.

SECTION 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances and all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are repealed to the extent of the conflict.

SECTION 6. Should any section or provision of this ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remainder hereof other than the part declared to be invalid.
