**A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA
SUPPORTING THE CAMPAIGN TO DEFEND LOCAL
SOLUTIONS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, the “Campaign to Defend Local Solutions” is a non-partisan grassroots coalition of individuals and organizations standing together to defend local solutions to local problems; and

WHEREAS, this effort has been working to build a network of individuals, organizations, and elected officials working to counteract the national trend of state legislatures increasingly preempting local government home rule powers; and

WHEREAS, the Campaign to Defend Local Solutions works to support cities challenging preemption laws within the judicial system; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Art. 8, Section 2(b) of the Florida Constitution and the Municipal Home Rule Powers Act, Section 166.021, Florida Statutes, municipalities shall have governmental, corporate and proprietary powers to enable them to conduct municipal government, perform municipal functions and render municipal services, and may exercise any power for municipal purposes except as otherwise provided by law; and

WHEREAS, the State of Florida is a diverse state with localities requiring individual solutions. Challenges must often be met with unique local solutions that go above and beyond any State solution that may be too broad and nonresponsive to local needs; and

WHEREAS, by approving the attached Resolution, the Mayor and City Commission of the City of Hallandale Beach are exemplifying belief that protecting the policies of our community is paramount.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. The foregoing “Whereas” clauses are incorporated herein.

33 **SECTION 2.** The Mayor and City Commission of Hallandale Beach support the
34 Campaign to Defend Local Solutions to protect the Florida Constitutional right of
35 municipalities to have governmental, corporate and proprietary powers to enable them to
36 conduct municipal government responsive to the needs of their residents.

37 **SECTION 3.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage and
