L4	WHEREAS, the Campaign to Defend Local Solutions works to support cities
L5	challenging preemption laws within the judicial system; and
L6	WHEREAS, pursuant to Art. 8, Section 2(b) of the Florida Constitution and the
L7	Municipal Home Rule Powers Act, Section 166.021, Florida Statutes, municipalities shall
L8	have governmental, corporate and proprietary powers to enable them to conduct
L9	municipal government, perform municipal functions and render municipal services, and
20	may exercise any power for municipal purposes except as otherwise provided by law; and
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22	WHEREAS, the State of Florida is a diverse state with localities requiring individual
23	solutions. Challenges must often be met with unique local solutions that go above and
24	beyond any State solution that may be too broad and nonresponsive to local needs; and
