12 13	WHEREAS, President Trump's March 2017 budget submission to Congress
13 14	outlined the administration's plan to reduce domestic spending and increase funding of
14 15	
	the Department of Defense, and would completely eliminate 66 federal programs, for a
16	savings of \$26.7 billion; and
17	WHEREAS and of the proposed programs to be eliminated in the Community
18	WHEREAS, one of the proposed programs to be eliminated is the Community
19 20	Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program administered by the Department of Housing
20 21	and Urban Development (HUD); and
21	WHEREAS, authorized by the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974,
23	the CDBG Program was enacted to provide block grant funding for community
23	development programs, assisting urban, suburban and rural communities to improve
25	housing and living conditions; and
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27	WHEREAS, CDBG programs also provide vital resources for local economic
28	development, job creation and retention projects; and
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30	WHEREAS, currently CDBG is funded at \$3 billion for FY 2017 under a continuing
31	Resolution and has experienced funding cuts by 25 percent (25%) totaling \$1 billion since
32	FY 2010; and
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34	WHEREAS, the City of Hallandale Beach has received \$1,032,602 in CDBG
35	grants since 2013. On March 15, 2017, the City Commission approved the City of
36	Hallandale Beach's grant application for the 43rd Year (FY 2017-2018) Community

Development Block Grant (CDBG) for \$208,200 for the After-School Tutorial Program and
 Public Works Improvements; and

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WHEREAS, for each of the last five years, the City has received an average of
\$206,520 in grant funding. The elimination of the CDBG funding would result in a
reduction of future funding for the City's After School Tutorial Enrichment Program, Public
Works Improvement Projects and other future HUD approved projects; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission urge the Federal Government to
oppose the proposed elimination and any further reductions in funding for the CDBG
Program.

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49NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY50COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:

52 <u>SECTION 1.</u> <u>Recitals Adopted</u>. That each of the above recitals are hereby 53 adopted, confirmed, and incorporated herein.

55 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Opposing Funding Reductions for CDBG Program. The Mayor 56 and City Commission of the City of Hallandale Beach oppose the proposed elimination 57 and further reductions in funding to the United States Department of Housing and Urban 58 Development Community Development Block Grant Program.

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60 **SECTION 3.** Direction to City Manager. The Mayor and City Commission direct 61 the City Manager to cause a copy of this resolution to be forwarded to all appropriate 62 parties.

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64 <u>SECTION 4</u>. <u>Effective Date.</u> This Resolution shall become effective immediately
