Short Title:

A RESOLUTION OF THE CHAIR AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE HALLANDALE BEACH COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY, HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA; APPROVING AND ADOPTING THE AMENDED AND RESTATED BY-LAWS OF THE HALLANDALE BEACH COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Staff Summary:

Background:

The By-laws of the Hallandale Beach Community Redevelopment Agency (HBCRA) address the administration and management of the CRA. Florida Statute 163 Part III, which is known as the "Community Redevelopment" Act, sets the stage for the governance of all 224 Community Redevelopment Agencies across the State of Florida. Although the statute does not explicitly describe the role of a CRA's By-laws, numerous elements from the statute such as the creation and function of a CRA board (FS. 163.356) were included in the HBCRA's By-laws.

Current Situation:

The HBCRA's By-laws were last updated in 2012. There are six proposed amendments to the By-laws, which will serve to clarify language regarding the relationship between the City and the HBCRA. These six proposed changes are as follows:

- 1. Provides clear language that the Board shall appoint the Executive Director of the HBCRA.
- 2. Provides clear language that the City Clerk shall serve as the Secretary of the HBCRA.
- 3. Provides clear language that the City of Hallandale Beach's (COHB) Finance Director shall serve as the Treasurer for the CRA.
- 4. Provides clear language that the City of Hallandale Beach's (COHB) Budget Director shall serve as the Budget Officer for the CRA.
- 5. Provides clear language that the HBCRA adopts the City's Personnel Policies.
- 6. Provides clear language that the HBCRA adopts the City's Procurement, Finance and Human Resources Policies.
- 7. Increases the HBCRA Executive Directors purchasing power from \$25,000 for consultant services, and to \$50,000 for all other goods and services. This which brings it in-line with the current purchasing power of the City Manager.

Fiscal Impact:

Why Action is Necessary:

The HBCRA By-laws need to be amended in order to ensure that the CRA continues to be in compliance with Florida Statutes 163, Part III.

Proposed Action:

The Executive Director recommends approval of the amended and restated By-laws.
