A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH BROWARD COUNTY FOR TEMPORARY DEBRIS MANAGEMENT SITES AND OTHER RELATED SERVICES WITH THE TERM STARTING UPON EXECUTION OF THE AGREEMENT AND ENDING ON NOVEMBER 30, 2022; FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE ALL RELATED DOCUMENTS TO EFFECTUATE THE PROJECT; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Short Title:

Staff Summary:

Background:

In the event of a disaster, such as a hurricane, the City has historically used Peter Bluesten Park as an approved Temporary Debris Management Site (TDMS). In the past, disaster debris from throughout the City was hauled, by contractor, to this site where it were ground/chipped for ease of transport and then hauled to its final destination. Moving forward, Peter Bluesten Park is no longer available for this use because the Park is under construction. The City does not own any other approved TDMS, therefore staff recommends that the City enter into an Interlocal Agreement with Broward County to enable the City to use the County's TDMS locations following disastrous events.

Current Situation:

On February 27, 2018 the Board of County Commissioners approved an ILA enabling municipalities to utilize the County's TDMS locations following disastrous events (Exhibit 2). Government entities must execute this ILA by March 31, 2018 in order to use the County's sites. The ILA becomes effective upon execution and will terminate on November 30, 2022. Upon mutual written consent, the ILA can be extended for two additional five-year terms. City staff recommends moving forward with executing this agreement.

Exhibit 3 contains a map and list of the County's 2017 Proposed Disaster Debris Management Sites. The two sites listed for Hallandale Beach are no longer active, however there are a number of available sites within close proximity to the City. Broward County will release an updated list of available sites for the 2018 hurricane season. Staff recommends that the City participate in the ILA until the end of the initial term and then will reevaluate its renewal options.

Fiscal Impact:

Historically, in the event of a disaster, City contractors haul debris to a TDMS and the cost of this service is based upon debris weight and volume. The ILA states that each City shall be invoiced for the proportionate share of the cost for the associated Debris Management Center staff time. This proportionate share will be based upon the volume of debris delivered by or on behalf of the City to the TDMS. Entering into an ILA with Broward County to enable the City to use the County's TDMS locations may be associated with a relatively small fiscal impact due to the fact that debris haulers will have to move debris to the County TDMS locations situated outside of the City limits. However, there are a number of TDMS locations in close proximity to the City (Hollywood and Pembroke Pines).

Why Action is Necessary:

City Commission approval is needed in order to enter into the Interlocal Agreement by and between Broward County and the City of Hallandale Beach for use of the County's Temporary Debris Management Sites following disastrous events.

Proposed Action:

Staff recommends approval of the attached Resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute the Interlocal Agreement by and between Broward County and the City of Hallandale Beach for the use of the County's Temporary Debris Management Sites following disastrous events.
