19	WHEREAS, the City of Hallandale Beach (City) agreed to partner with the South Florida			
20	Regional Planning Council (SFRPC) to submit a request for funding through the Department of			
21	Economic Opportunity (DEO) Community Planning and Technical Assistance grant program to			
22	evaluate the City's susceptibility to current and future flood risk; and			
23	WHEREAS, as part of this grant program, the City Administration has prepared proposed			
24	Comprehensive Plan amendments to the Coastal Management Element consistent with the Peril			
25	of Flood requirements outlined in Section 163.3178(2)(f), Florida Statutes; and			
26	WHEREAS, on November 1, 2017, the City of Hallandale Beach City Commission			
27	approved transmittal of the City Comprehensive Plan Evaluation and Appraisal Report (E.A.R.)			
28	based amendments pursuant to Section 163.3191, Florida Statutes; and			
29	WHEREAS, on March 2, 2018, DEO provided comments and recommendations from the			
30	Department and other appropriate reviewing agencies regarding the proposed E.A.R. based			
31	amendments, including comments and recommendations concerning the Coastal Management			
32	Element for the City's consideration; and			
33	WHEREAS, the SFRPC and the City have determined changes are necessary to update			
34	the Coastal Management Element and have implemented the recommendations from DEO and			
35	reviewing agencies; and

WHEREAS, on March 28, 2018, the Planning and Zoning Board, serving as the Local Planning Agency, considered the proposed amendments to the Comprehensive Plan Coastal Management Element and afforded all interested persons an opportunity to be heard at the public meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission have conducted duly noticed public hearings
on the proposed amendments to the City's Comprehensive Plan, as required by Chapter 163,
Florida Statutes; and

43 **WHEREAS,** the Mayor and City Commission have determined that the proposed 44 amendments are in the best interest of the City of Hallandale Beach and its residents.

45 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF 46 HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:

47 SECTION 1. Approval of Coastal Management Element Amendments. The Mayor and City Commission of Hallandale Beach, Florida hereby approve the Hallandale Beach 48 49 Comprehensive Plan Coastal Management Element amendments, as incorporated herein as 50 attached "Exhibit 2", to include various updates of definitions, objectives and policies in the 51 Coastal Management Element related to floodplain management, flood insurance and climate 52 adaptation, consistent with Chapter 163, Part II, Florida Statutes. The amendments include an 53 update to the Coastal High Hazard Area Map, attached as Figure 6-1, to depict the Coastal High Hazard Area. 54

55 <u>SECTION 2.</u> <u>Transmittal.</u> The Comprehensive Plan as hereby amended shall be 56 transmitted to all appropriate reviewing agencies as provided in Section 163.3184, Florida 57 Statutes.

58 **SECTION 3. Conflict.** All ordinances or portions of the Code of Ordinances of the City 59 of Hallandale Beach in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be repealed to the extent 60 of such conflict.

61 **SECTION 4. Severability.** Should any provision of this ordinance be declared by a court 62 of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a 63 whole, or any part thereof, other that the part declared to be invalid.

64 <u>SECTION 5.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> The provisions of this ordinance shall become effective 65 concurrent to or after adoption of the City's Comprehensive Plan Evaluation and Appraisal Report 66 (E.A.R) based amendments, pursuant to Section 163.3184, Florida Statutes.
