A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO REJECT ALL BIDS FOR INVITATION

TO BID #FY 2017-2018-004, A1A BUS SHELTER IMPROVEMENTS FROM A. THOMAS CONSTRUCTION INC.; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO RE-ADVERTISE THE INVITATION TO BID WITH MODIFICATIONS TO THE SCOPE OF WORK; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Staff Summary:

Background:

The City promotes consistency in bus stop replacement and design throughout its jurisdiction. Furthermore, members of the community are more apt to use public transit services when transit facilities are comfortable and convenient. Therefore, the City adheres to the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act and provides a shelter for passengers that will protect against environmental conditions at bus stop locations.

The City planned to install six (6) bus shelters (4 replacement shelters and 2 new) on A1A as a part of an area improvement project. The locations and design for these bus shelters can be found in Exhibit 2. The existing shelters do not belong to the City and would have been removed and used elsewhere in Hallandale Beach by Martin Gold Coast. This firm maintains bus shelters and benches under a separate contract with the City.

The design phase of the project has been completed and the City moved forward with awarding a construction contract.

An amount of \$197,018 is available to fund Project CIP # 10412. The 2000 South Ocean Drive Development Agreement will contribute \$40,000 to this project. Staff released BID # FY2017-2018-004, A1A Bus Shelter Improvements, on November 21, 2017 (Exhibit 3). Two (2) proposals were received for six shelters: 1) A. Thomas Construction Inc. in the amount of \$172,620 and 2) Double Edged Construction, Inc. and Advanced Service Management, Inc. in the amount of \$175,600.

The submittal from A. Thomas Construction Inc. was deemed to be the lowest responsive and responsible bid. Staff recommended that the City Commission award the Bid to A. Thomas Construction Inc. during the February 21, 2018 City Commission meeting.

Current Situation

During the February 21, 2018 meeting the City Commission requested that the City Manager defer the contract award (to A. Thomas Construction Inc.) and release a new bid to procure services for a different scope of work. The original scope of work included a replacement of 4 bus shelters and the installation of 2 new bus shelters.

The City Commission has requested that the City Manager release a new bid which will procure services to install two (2) new bus shelters and leave the four (4) existing bus shelters, which contain advertising, as the shelters currently exist. The shelters to be installed, which do not contain advertising, are located at 2030 South Ocean Drive and 1850 South Ocean Drive. The cost savings achieved through this reduction in the scope of services will be allocated to other locations in the City where new transit facilities are needed or where minimum requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) are not being met.

Staff will bring this item back for City Commission consideration of award once the second bidding process is completed.

Why Action is Necessary:

Pursuant to the City of Hallandale Beach Code of Ordinances, Chapter 23, Section 23-12, Procedures for purchases in excess of \$50,000, (4) Rejection of Bids, the City Commission may authorize City Manager to: a. Reject all bids; or b) reject all bids and re-advertise, pursuant to the procedure prescribed in this section in the Code.

Proposed Action:

Staff recommends approval of the attached Resolution authorizing the City Manager to reject BID # FY 2017-2018-004, A1A Bus Shelter Improvements, and re-advertise the bid.
