3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11	AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 2 "ADMINISTRATION," ARTICLE III "BOARDS, COMMITTEES, DISTRICTS AND AUTHORITIES," TO APPLY GENERAL ADVISORY BOARD PROVISIONS TO THE HISTORICAL PRESERVATION BOARD; AMENDING THE TOTAL NUMBER OF MEMBERS AND DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
12	WHEREAS, during the commission workshop meetings of February 13, 2017, March 13,
13	2017 and April 17, 2017 the City Commission reviewed the composition, powers and
14	responsibilities of all City Advisory Boards and Committees; and
15	WHEREAS, in order to be eligible for certain grant funding and other state and federal aid,
16	a local government must maintain a historic preservation board which is properly staffed to
17	accomplish its purpose; and
18	WHEREAS, the City administration recommends that it is in the best interest of the
19	residents of the City to maintain a historic preservation board subject to the general rules
20	applicable to advisory boards and committees.
21	NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF
22	HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:
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24	SECTION 1. The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby incorporated herein.
25	SECTION 2. Chapter 2 "Administration," Sections 2-301 of the Code of Ordinances of
26	the City of Hallandale Beach, Florida is hereby renumbered to Division 2, "Advisory Boards and
27	Committees" and amended to read as follows:
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29	ARTICLE III BOARDS, COMMITTEES, DISTRICTS AND AUTHORITIES
30	DIVISION 2. ADVISORY BOARDS AND COMMITTEES
31	Sec. 2- 301 105 Historic preservation board ; created and established.
32	(a) There is hereby created an historic preservation board (hereinafter "the board") as
33	an advisory board to the city commission of the City of Hallandale Beach which shall
34	meet no less than four (4) times per year. The board is hereby vested with the

power, authority, and jurisdiction to recommend designation, regulation, and
 administration of aesthetic, archaeological, architectural, cultural, historical, and
 paleontological resources within the city.

(b) Members. The board shall consist of five (5) members appointed by the
 city commission. The city commission should attempt to appoint persons with
 education, experience, training, and interest in the fields of archaeology, architecture,
 art, history, law, urban planning, natural history, and real estate or other individuals
 with related backgrounds or from the business, financial, and other segments of the
 community who, by virtue of their profession, business, or other ties to the city have
 demonstrated a concern and interest in historic preservation within the city.

45 (c) The city manager shall provide adequate professional staff for the 46 operational support of the board.

47 (d) Powers and duties. In addition to those responsibilities required of all
 48 advisory boards and committees, the historic preservation board shall have the
 49 following enumerated powers and duties:

(1) Make recommendations to the city commission for adoption or 50 51 amendment to rules and procedures reasonably necessary and 52 appropriate for the proper administration and enforcement of the 53 provisions of this section. 54 (2) Recommend designation of individual sites, districts, archaeological and paleontological zones to the city commission. 55 56 (3) Recommend issuance or denial of special certificates of 57 appropriateness and certificates to dig to the city commission. 58 Establish, maintain, and update guidelines for preservation and (4) criteria for the issuance by staff of regular certificates of 59 60 appropriateness.

61(5) Approve historic markers and provide other recognition for62individual sites, districts, and zones.

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 (6)
 Promote the awareness of historic preservation and its

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 community benefits.

65(7) Establish, review and update the city's historic survey.66(8) Identify sources of historic records pertaining to the city.

67	(9) Serve as central collection point for donation of historic
68	documents pertaining to the city.
69	(10) Archive, catalogue, and maintain all historic documents of the
70	<u>city.</u>
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72	SECTION 3. Sections 2-301 to 2-306 are hereby repealed and reserved for future use.
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74	SECTION 4. Conflict. All ordinances or portions of the Code of Ordinances of the City
75	of Hallandale Beach in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be repealed to the
76	extent of such conflict.
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78	SECTION 5. Severability. Should any provision of this ordinance be declared by a
79	court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the
80	ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part declared to be invalid.
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82	SECTION 6. Codification. It is the intention of the Mayor and City Commission that the
83	provisions of this ordinance be incorporated into the Code of Ordinances; to effect such
84	intention the words "ordinance" or "section" may be changed to other appropriate words.
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86	SECTION 7. Effective date. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon
87	adoption.
