DISCUSSION OF POSSIBLE MERGER OF CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH PUBLIC SAFETY SERVICES WITH BROWARD COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE.

Staff Summary:

Background:

During the August 15, 2018 regular City Commission meeting, the City Commission directed staff to schedule a special City Commission meeting for August 27, 2018 to

discuss the possibility of merging the City's public safety services with Broward County Sheriff's Office (BSO). In addition, the City Commission requested a series of documents, attached herewith, to assist with the discussion.

Current Situation:

As requested by the City Commission, documents are attached herewith. Staff is seeking direction from the City Commission regarding whether staff should engage in discussions with BSO concerning the feasibility of merging the City's public safety services – Police and Fire – with BSO.

Fiscal Impact:

While there will be a fiscal impact to these discussions – the City will retain outside counsel – the cost at this time is unknown. Staff is requesting authorization to spend an amount not to exceed \$25,000 for outside counsel.

Why Action is Necessary:

The City Commission has expressed interest in looking at the feasibility of a possible merger of the City's public safety services – Police and Fire – with BSO. City Administration is requesting formal direction in this matter to proceed with the discussions with BSO.

Proposed Action:

Motion by a majority of the City Commission directing staff to begin discussions with BSO and authorizing an expenditure not to exceed \$25,000 for outside counsel.
