51 52	SECTION 2. That the City Commission during the budget hearing for Fiscal Year 2018-19
53	has, by motion, made adjustments to the proposed Budget adopted by this Ordinance, as it deems
54	necessary and proper. The City Commission approves the following additional budget items to
55	balance the General Fund:
56	a. A nine (9) month moratorium on filling existing and projected position vacancies (exempting
57	first responders and sworn Police Officers' vacant positions) resulting in a projected savings
58	of \$680,930. The City Manager has the discretion to fill the affected positions, as deemed
59	necessary.

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b. Deferred further reduction of Administrative Charges from other funds to the General Fund of

\$1,067,238 pending new Cost Allocation Study to be conducted in Fiscal Year 2018/19.

c. Deferred General Fund lease payment of \$1,012,569 to the Fleet Services Fund in Fiscal Year 2018/19. The lease payment will resume in Fiscal Year 2019/20.

SECTION 3. In an effort to insure regularity and to better control expenses, the following budget appropriations are included in Fiscal Year 2018-19:

a. Re-appropriations of Fiscal Year 2017-18 unspent funds into Fiscal Year 2018-19 are as follows:

b. The City Commission authorizes the utilization of fund balance to balance the Police Training Fund, Law Enforcement Trust Fund, Police Equitable Sharing Fund and the Capital Projects Funds.

c. The City Commission authorizes the re-appropriation of \$825,435 in health insurance savings from Fiscal Year 2017-18 to Fiscal Year 2018-19 in the General Fund.

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SECTION 4. That when the City of Hallandale Beach receives monies from any source, be it private or governmental, by grant, gift, or otherwise, to which there is attached as a condition of acceptance, any limitation regarding the use or expenditure of the monies received, the funds so received need not be shown in the Annual Budget nor shall said budget be subject to amendment or expenditure as a result of the receipt of said monies, but said monies shall only be disbursed and applied toward the purposes for which the said funds were received. To ensure the integrity of the Operating Budget, and the integrity of the monies received by the City under grants or gifts, all monies received as contemplated above must, upon receipt, be segregated and accounted for based upon generally accepted accounting principles and placed into separate revenue and expenditure accounts established to properly account for all such funds and expenditures. Any money drawn from

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85	the established expenditure accounts may only be disbursed and applied within the limitations placed			
86	upon the gift or grant.			
87	SECTION 5. All ordinances or parts of ordina	ances and all resolutions or parts of resolutions		
88	in conflict herewith are repealed to the extent of the conflict.			
89	SECTION 6. Should any section or provision of this ordinance be declared by a court of			
90	competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remainder hereof			
91	other than the part declared to be invalid.			
92	SECTION 7. This Ordinance shall take effect on October 1, 2018.
