**NOMINATION OF ANTHONY C. MUSTO FOR THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH
DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., HUMANITARIAN AWARD**

Prof. Anthony C. Musto's extensive accomplishments at the national, state, and local levels would make him a very worthy recipient of the City of Hallandale Beach Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Humanitarian Award. This document will summarize some of those accomplishments, particularly as they relate to five specific areas, promoting and providing pro bono legal services to the poor, protecting children, promotion of diversity, public service, and service to the legal profession.

Promoting and Providing Pro Bono Legal Services to the Poor

Prof. Musto has been a leader in legal profession's effort to meet the legal needs of those who cannot afford representation.

His efforts in this regard includes his tenure at the Broward County Attorney's Office, where he was responsible for that office's groundbreaking and innovative pro bono program. While such programs are not unusual today, at that time pro bono work by government lawyers was almost unheard of. The program overcame the many obstacles and objections to the provision of pro bono services by publically employed lawyers (concerns such as conflicts of interest and appearances of conflicts, the use of government facilities and resources, the need for malpractice insurance, letterhead stationery and trust accounts, etc.) to such an extent that it became a model for other offices throughout the country. It was cited by Chief Justice Rosemary Barkett in the specially concurring opinion she wrote when the Florida Supreme Court adopted aspirational goals for pro bono service by Florida lawyers. *Amendments to Rules Regulating The Florida Bar* 1-3.1(a) and *Rules of Judicial Admin. 2.065 (Legal Aid)*, 630 So. 2d 501, 506 (Fla. 1993).

The trailblazing nature of this program is also reflected by the office becoming the first governmental agency ever to receive the American Bar Association Pro Bono Publico Award and the first ever to receive the Florida Supreme Court Chief Justice's Law Firm Commendation. It also played an important role in Prof. Musto's personal receipt of the Florida Association of County Attorneys' President's Award, the organization's highest honor.

Along with the County Attorney, Prof. Musto wrote an article in a national publication about the office's program¹ and made presentations about it at national events hosted by the American Bar Association Government and Public Sector Lawyers Division and the International Municipal Lawyers Association. The program before the municipal lawyers group led to the receipt of the National Association of County Information Officers Award of Excellence by Prof. Musto and the County Attorney.

As part of the pro bono effort at the County Attorney's Office, Prof. Musto, a board certified appellate lawyer, established the office's Veterans Appeals Project and personally handled cases for indigent veterans in the United States Court of Veterans Appeals. Those cases included one in which he was able to obtain relief for a veteran who was initially denied benefits when he was diagnosed with cancer many years after being one of the first American troops to enter Hiroshima and Nagasaki after the atomic bomb was dropped on those cities.

Another aspect of the program developed by Prof. Musto was the ACLF (Adult Congregate Living Facility) Program, which provided legal assistance to indigent or low income residents of Broward

County nursing homes and other care facilities, particularly with regard to issues relating to their living conditions.

Prof. Musto continued his devotion to the pro bono movement in his work as the Director of Community Outreach and Pro Bono Services for St. Thomas University School of Law. In this capacity, he ran a program that provided over 10,000 hours of pro bono service each year. He always personally handled some cases himself and in those cases provided opportunities for students who lacked the transportation necessary to volunteer at legal service offices or elsewhere to participate in the program.

Since moving in 2016 from a full-time to an adjunct position at St. Thomas, Prof. Musto has focused his practice to a great extent on pro bono matters, contributing over 700 hours of pro bono service to indigent clients in 2017 alone, most of which were devoted to the best interests of children and which included extensive work on behalf of the Statewide Guardian ad Litem Program.

Presently, Prof. Musto is serving as the President of the Board of Directors of Florida Legal Services, Inc., a statewide program providing free legal representation to the poor in impact litigation. He is also a member of the Board of Directors of The Florida Bar Foundation, a foundation dedicated to the mission of providing greater access to justice in Florida through initiatives and grant programs that award millions of dollars each year to entities providing representation and other assistance to indigent and low income individuals.

While serving as the Chair of The Florida Bar Public Interest Law Section, Prof. Musto established statewide pro bono programs to help provide representation for teens aging out of foster care and for human trafficking victims seeking sealing and expunction of criminal records arising from acts committed while under the influence of their traffickers. He coordinated with the Bar's membership department and the Young Lawyers Division to recruit new and young lawyers for the foster care pro bono program.

Prof. Musto had the honor of being appointed to, and serving on, the American Bar Association Standing Committee on Professionalism. In that capacity, he authored a chapter entitled "Pro Bono and Public Service" in "Essential Qualities of the Professional Lawyer," a book published by the committee and used as a text in many law schools. More recently, he added a chapter in a subsequently published instructor's manual for the book.

In 2001, Prof. Musto was elected to the Hallandale Beach City Commission. Among his accomplishments when serving in that capacity was writing, introducing, and having passed, a resolution allowing the City Attorney and his or her assistants to provide pro bono legal services to the poor.

Prof. Musto's efforts even extend back to his law school days, when he spent two summers (one part-time and one full-time) working at Columbus Community Legal Services in Washington, D.C., where he received a Corpus Juris Secundum Civic Achievement Award as the outstanding student intern at that organization, and spent his entire third year as a certified intern at the District of Columbia Law Students in Court Program representing indigent persons charged with criminal offenses. He also worked with his law school's Draft Information Group (DIG), providing legal advice to individuals facing the possibility of being drafted into the armed services at a time when the Vietnam War was still being waged.

Due to his lifelong devotion to efforts such as those outlined above, Prof. Musto was presented earlier this summer with the John R. Hamilton Pro Bono Award, one of the two highest honors bestowed by the Appellate Practice Section of The Florida Bar.

Protecting Children

An ongoing commitment to the protection and the best interests of children has been a hallmark of Prof. Musto's career.

As noted above, Prof. Musto's pro bono efforts have included handling cases in which he represents children's best interests through the Statewide Guardian ad Litem Office. He also represents children in delinquency matters on a pro bono basis and has served as a Special Counsel for Florida's Department of Children and Families (DCF). In that capacity, he has protected many children from abusive home situations. One case of note involved a father who viciously beat one of his two small children to a point that required the child to be airlifted to a hospital, where he remained for 55 days. The beating was so extensive that the police initially investigated the case as a homicide, although the child miraculously survived. Despite the fact that the father had also previously beaten the mother, the trial court, while revoking the father's parental rights to the beaten child, refused to revoke them as to the second child. Prof. Musto handled the appeal from the order and obtained a reversal that ended the father's opportunity to have access to the second child.

Prof. Musto is in his sixth year as a member of the American Bar Association Commission on Youth at Risk (a tenure that followed two years on the Commission's advisory committee). The Commission advocates for fairness and opportunities for disadvantaged and homeless children. It provides hands on events throughout the country (generally tied in to the dates and locations of Commission meetings). For instance, this past year, it organized, and Prof. Musto participated in, a summit held in Tampa of area organizations providing services to homeless teens and a project held in Chicago that packed and provided kits of toiletries, towels, socks, and other necessities for children living on the streets of that city. The Commission also proposes and supports (or opposes) legislation, at both the national and state levels, and engages in numerous other efforts.

Prof. Musto is also a former Co-Chair of the American Bar Association Criminal Justice Section Juvenile Justice Committee. In this capacity, he successfully advocated for a comprehensive review of the ABA's Juvenile Justice Standards, a process that is currently underway. During his tenure, he helped organize and spoke at a program dealing with the legal implications of case law relating to the manner in which teenage brains function and how they mature as the teenager becomes an adult.

In addition, Prof. Musto was appointed to a special committee charged by the Florida Supreme Court with making recommendations to Florida's Commission on District Court of Appeal Performance and Accountability to improve the processes for appeals in dependency and termination of parental rights matters. That report led to the significant changes that were adopted in the decision of *In re Amendments to the Florida Rules of Judicial Administration, the Florida Rules of Juvenile Procedure, and the Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure—Implementation of the Commission on District Court of Appeal Performance and Accountability Recommendations*, 24 So. 3d 49 (Fla. 2009).

Prof. Musto is also a long time member of The Florida Bar Legal Needs of Children Committee, a body which focuses on legislative, policy, and legal matters relating to children.

Additionally, he served on the Advisory Board of the Dade County School Board's Law Education Goals and Learning (LEGAL) Project, a program that promotes legal education in the public schools. In this capacity, he was one of the founders and first participants in the Kids and Criminal Justice Program, which sends teams of prosecutors, defense attorneys and police officers into schools in high crime areas to give students a realistic perception of how the criminal court system impacts the lives of those who enter it. His efforts with this group resulted in Prof. Musto's receipt of the Dade County Schools Outstanding Contribution to Law Education Award.

At St. Thomas, one of the classes Prof. Musto taught was Juvenile Law. And he was the faculty representative for student involvement in the Lawyers for Literacy Program, which sends lawyers, judges, professors, and students into schools with a significant number of at-risk students, homeless shelters, and the juvenile detention facility to make presentations on various life skills, such as financial, legal, and educational matters. Further, he organized the annual training program that the Miami-Dade County Teen Court (a program that diverts certain cases from the courts to tribunals in which teenagers adjudicate the disposition of matters involving their peers) holds at the law school.

Prof. Musto was the driving force behind the creation of board certification in the field of juvenile law in Florida, a much sought after credential that has helped raise the level of practice and professionalism in cases involving children. He personally wrote the certification rules that were adopted, attended and spoke at every meeting of The Florida Bar Board of Legal Specialization and Education at which the matter was considered (a process that took several years), and he achieved certification himself. He is one of only 133 Florida lawyers to do so (about 1/8 of 1 percent of the members of The Florida Bar).

Moreover, Prof. Musto has published scholarly articles on legal issues relating to children.² His articles have been cited in opinions written by Florida courts and by the Supreme Court of Hawaii. He has also served as a panelist or moderator in continuing legal education programs dealing with juvenile law.³

Promotion of Diversity

Prof. Musto has worked to promote diversity in many contexts. As the Chair of the City of Hallandale Beach Community Relations Committee, and in his role as a newspaper columnist, he

advocated for and produced a proposal to increase the City's minority hiring and recruitment for managerial positions. While the specific proposal was not adopted by the City, it raised awareness and the City's efforts in that regard greatly improved after the recommendation. As the Chair of the City's Charter Review Committee, he wrote and was successful in persuading the Committee to adopt a proposal calling for more diversity in future incarnations of the Committee and one that would have increased the likelihood of minority representation on the City Commission through a hybrid election process.

In an effort that truly had widespread impact, Prof. Musto played an important role in establishing Florida law that bars discrimination and requires diversity in jury selection in civil cases. Before the United States Supreme Court decided *Batson v. Kentucky*, 476 U.S. 79 (1986), prohibiting the use of peremptory challenges on the basis of race, the Florida Supreme Court in *State v. Neil*, 457 So. 2d 481 (Fla. 1984) had already reached that conclusion under the Florida Constitution with regard to criminal cases. In the wake of *Neil*, an appeal taken by the City of Miami to the Third District Court of Appeal involved the issue of whether the *Neil* rationale extended to civil cases. The appellee (the party who had sued the City) in the case chose not to file a brief, so the only brief before the court was one submitted by the City arguing that *Neil* did not apply. When the Third District appointed an attorney to serve as an *amicus curiae* (friend of the court) on behalf of the appellee and to argue the opposite position, the City filed a petition for a writ of prohibition in the Florida Supreme Court, arguing that the court had no jurisdiction to appoint counsel. In those days, the judge or court that was the subject of such a petition was the named party to the prohibition proceeding, so the Third District was ordered to respond to the petition. It contacted Prof. Musto, who had no prior involvement with the case, and asked him to represent it. The request itself is a demonstration of the high esteem in which Prof. Musto is held as an attorney. He of course accepted the court's invitation and prevailed in the proceeding, thereby upholding the court's right to obtain the input of counsel on this critical issue, input that led to the expansion of the *Neil* principle to civil matters. *City of Miami v. Cornett*, 463 So. 2d 399 (Fla. 3d DCA 1985).

Prof. Musto chaired the Florida Criminal Procedure Rules Committee, a body charged with making recommendations to the Florida Supreme Court for amendments to the rules governing criminal cases. Upon being informed of his appointment to this important and prestigious position, he realized that there was a severe imbalance on the Committee with regard to race, ethnicity, and gender. He contacted the incoming President of The Florida Bar, who was charged with making the Committee appointments for the upcoming year, brought the matter to the President's attention, recruited qualified members of each underrepresented group, and successfully lobbied for appointments that greatly changed the makeup of the body.

Public Service

Prof. Musto's accomplishments as a Hallandale Beach City Commissioner include expanding the homestead exemption for senior citizens living below the poverty level, establishing a community relations committee, creating the positions of economic development coordinator and community and press liaison, initiating a performance review process for the City Manager and City Attorney, televising certain city board meetings, instituting quasi-judicial proceedings for land use matters, putting in a reverse-911 system to warn residents of dangerous situations, updating the city's web site, and, as noted above, enabling the City Attorney and his or her assistants to participate in pro bono activities.

After his tenure on the Commission, he not only chaired the City's Charter Review and Community Relations Committees, as discussed above, but he also chaired the City's Ad Hoc Parking Committee, which produced extensive suggestions for improving parking throughout Hallandale Beach.

In addition, he served as a member of the Board of Directors of the Hallandale Beach Community Development Agency, which provided affordable housing and financial assistance for persons who could not otherwise afford to own homes, a Trustee of the City of Hallandale Beach Police Officers and Firefighters Personnel Retirement Trust, a member of the Broward County League of Cities Environmental and Legislative Committees, and the President of the Hallandale Symphonic Pops Orchestra.

His legal career also demonstrates a dedication to public service. Over the years, he has served in such positions an Assistant Florida Attorney General, the Chief Counsel of the Attorney General's Miami Office, an Assistant State Attorney, an Assistant Public Defender, the Chief Appellate Counsel for the Broward County Attorney's Office, a Special Counsel for Florida's Department of Children and Families, a Special Assistant Criminal Conflict and Civil Regional Counsel, and a traffic magistrate. His efforts in the public arena were so outstanding that he received The Florida Bar Claude Pepper Award, which is presented for "exemplifying the highest ideals of dedication, professionalism, and ethics in serving the government as a government lawyer."

Prof. Musto has also served the public interest in his practice by playing an important role in shaping the procedures governing the courts of this state. In over 20 proceedings, he has represented various entities in Florida Supreme Court rules proceedings,⁴ including cases relating to improving and shortening the processes involved in dependency appeals, the provision of legal services to the poor, the standards for counsel in capital cases, requiring fairness with regard to obtaining sealing and expunction

of criminal records, and making the criminal discovery, pretrial release and preliminary hearing processes more fair.

Service to the Legal Profession

Prof. Musto has an impressive record of service to the legal profession. Many of his accomplishments in that respect are included in the above sections of this document, so they will not be repeated here. Other matters not falling directly within one of the subjects addressed above are well worthy of note, however. They include the fact that he is presently a Co-Executive Director of the American Bar Association Criminal Justice Section Specialized Practice Division, which encompasses committees dealing with immigration, homeland security, terrorism, treatment of enemy combatants, global anti-corruption, international criminal law, cyber crime, appeals, habeas corpus, and section amicus curiae efforts.

Moreover, Prof. Musto is the only person to chair four sections of The Florida Bar. In each of those positions, he has achieved significant accomplishments.

As Chair of the Criminal Law Section, he coordinated a fund raising program that ensured the continuing viability of the section's Prosecutor/Public Defender Training Program held annually at the University of Florida College of Law. His efforts brought in over \$300,000 in donations and pledges. He also established an annual criminal law issue of the St. Thomas Law Review, lining up for the first issue such authors as the Attorney General of the United States and the Chief Justice of the Florida Supreme Court.

As Chair of the Government Lawyer Section, and in conjunction with the ABA Government and Public Sector Lawyers Division, he organized, hosted and spoke at the first national program on professionalism for government lawyers, which was held in Key West. He also established a statewide mentoring program to match young attorneys in public service with seasoned government lawyers. He initiated and spoke at what is now an annual program on practicing in the Florida Supreme Court, an innovative presentation that includes participants observing an actual oral argument, interacting with the attorneys arguing the case, and having a panel discussion with the justices.

As Chair of the Appellate Practice Section, he initiated two important ongoing programs, one of which provided the opportunity for practitioners to interact with and ask questions of the Florida Supreme Court justices, and the other of which dealt with practicing before the federal appeals court in Atlanta that handles appeals from Florida.

In addition to establishing the two pro bono programs discussed above during his tenure as Chair of the Public Interest Law Section, Prof. Musto organized and served as a moderator at a program dealing with ethical considerations in the practice of public interest law (Ethical and Professionalism Concerns in the Practice of Public Interest Law, presented on January 24, 2014, in Orlando). He also oversaw the production of the first of three section sponsored issues of the Florida Coastal Law Review devoted to public interest law. He reinstituted and converted to electronic format a section communication that brought matters relating to public interest law directly attorneys practicing in the field.

Further, Prof. Musto has chaired two statewide rules committees and has made extraordinary contributions in doing so. As Chair of the Rules of Judicial Administration Committee, he wrote, had

approved by the committee, argued in the Florida Supreme Court for, and had approved: (1) the Florida rule to establish a requirement that judges must ordinarily allow telephonic hearings upon request; (2) a rule for the disqualification of judges that resolved the conflicting prior versions from the criminal and civil rules; and (3) a rule requiring the use of recycled paper for all court filings, a rule estimated (prior to electronic filing) to have saved 850,000 trees each year. *The Florida Bar: Amendment to Florida Rules of Judicial Administration*, 609 So. 2d 465 (Fla. 1992).

As the Chair of the Criminal Procedure Rules Committee, he presided over the committee's deliberations regarding a comprehensive overhaul of the discovery process. He then authored the committee's submission on the subject in the Florida Supreme Court and argued successfully before that court for the adoption of the revisions. *In re Amendment to Florida Rule of Criminal Procedure 3.220 (Discovery)*, 550 So. 2d 1097 (Fla. 1989).

Pursuant to appointment by the Florida Supreme Court, Prof. Musto has served on that court's Committee on the Rule Making Process and its Committee on Standard Jury Instructions in Criminal Cases. In addition, he has been a member of the Court's Commission on Professionalism, as well as a member of the Seventeenth Judicial Circuit (Broward County) Professionalism Committee.

Prof. Musto has also served The Florida Bar as the Chair of its Council of Sections (a group comprised of the chairs of each section), a member of its Long Term Planning Committee, Appellate Practice Certification Committee, Appellate Court Rules Committee, Continuing Legal Education Committee, Federal Practice Committee, Special Committee on the Regulation of the Practice of Law, and Special Committee on the Enhancement of the Practice of Law.

Additional Awards

Throughout this document, when of particular note to the subject matter under discussion, reference has been made to some of the many awards Prof. Musto has received over the years. Two additional awards, which span the subjects set forth above, rather than relate to one particular aspect of Prof. Musto's background, should also be mentioned.

He is a recipient of the John J. Copelan, Jr., Public Interest Award, which is presented to "a member of The Florida Bar who has made significant contributions to the public interest and specifically the field of public interest law."

He has also been inducted into the Dr. Nan S. Hutchison Broward Senior Hall of Fame, which honors individuals for "excellence in the volunteer sector of Broward County."

Conclusion

Prof. Musto would be an outstanding choice as the recipient of the City of Hallandale Beach's Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Humanitarian Award. It would also be a particularly meaningful award to him because of his admiration of Dr. King and the fact that it would come from the city he loves, has served in many ways, and has made his home for over two decades.
