

**RESOLUTION NO. 2018-130**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, DECLARING A UNIQUE CIRCUMSTANCE FOR THE BROKERAGE OF MUNICIPAL INSURANCE PRODUCTS; RATIFYING THE RENEWAL OF THE CITY'S EXCESS WORKERS' COMPENSATION INSURANCE WITH FLORIDA MUNICIPAL TRUST FUND IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED FORTY EIGHT DOLLARS (\$155,348.00); AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE ALL RELATED DOCUMENTS TO EFFECTUATE THE INSURANCE AS PROVIDED FOR IN FISCAL YEAR 2018-2019 BUDGET; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 23-6, Award of Contracts, and 23-8, Unique Circumstances, the City Commission may declare unique circumstances as an exception to the requirements of competitive bidding; and

**WHEREAS**, unlike the procurement of most services, insurance products must be obtained through a broker who is paid a commission by the insurance company and not the city;

**WHEREAS,** market forces that typically apply during a competitive procurement process are further restricted because the City participates in the Florida Municipal Insurance Trust Fund, which is administered by the Florida League of Cities and limited only to municipalities, to insure its physical facilities; and

**WHEREAS**, the City is required to comply with the provisions of Florida Statute 440 by maintaining a Self-Insurance Fund; and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose is to ensure that if an employee is injured on the job, the worker will receive quick and efficient disability and medical benefits, if needed; and

**WHEREAS**, there are numerous governmental agencies throughout the State of Florida that participate in this pooled program; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Administration is recommending that the City retain Florida Municipal Trust Fund as its workers' compensation insurance provider for the total sum of one hundred fifty five thousand three hundred forty eight (\$155,348.00) dollars, subject to the annual audit adjustment; and

**WHEREAS**, the City believes that the renewal of the City's workers' compensation insurance through the Florida Municipal Insurance Trust Fund is the most cost effective for the City and in the best interest of the residents of the City.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:**

**SECTION 1.** The foregoing “Whereas” clauses are adopted herein.

**SECTION 2. Declaration of Unique Circumstances.** The Mayor and City Commission declare a Unique Circumstance pursuant to Chapter 23, Section 8(5) of the City of Hallandale Beach Code of Ordinances.

**SECTION 3. City Manager Authorization.** The Mayor and City Commission hereby approve the renewal of the City's workers' compensation insurance through the Florida Municipal Insurance Trust Fund in the estimated amount of one hundred fifty five thousand three hundred forty eight (\$155,348.00) dollars as provided for in fiscal year 2018-2019 budget, subject to the adjustment resulting from the required annual audit and authorizing the City Manager to execute all related documents to effectuate the renewal of the City's workers' compensation insurance.

**SECTION 4. Effective Date.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage and adoption.
