4	AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF
5	THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING
6 7	CHAPTER 32, "ZONING AND LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE; PROVIDING UPDATES TO REQUIREMENTS FOR STREET
8	TREES IN THE RDO REDEVELOPMENT OVERLAY AREA TO
9 10	ENHANCE THE CITY'S TREE CANOPY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR
11	SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

13	WHEREAS, trees make important contributions to society and are an integral part of
14	urban infrastructure. They are critical to the health and livability of communities as roads, sewers,
15	and buildings. Community trees leverage the social, economic, and environmental value of cities,
16	with forestry and related industries providing employment for over 1.6 million people and
17	contributing \$231.5 billion to the U.S. economy; and
18	
19	WHEREAS, urban forests provide an invaluable role in the protection of public health and
20	reduction of harmful greenhouse gases. Enhancing the tree canopy within the City supports
21	sustainability and beautification goals; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, enhancing the tree canopy in the RDO Redevelopment Overlay Area of the
24	City of Hallandale Beach will provide benefits to the health and welfare of the community, as well
25	as improve the aesthetics in the City's most visible corridor, and reduce greenhouse gases; and
26	
27	WHEREAS, the proposed amendments to Chapter 32, "Zoning and Land Development
28	Code" provide updates to the requirements for street trees in the RDO Redevelopment Overlay
29	Area to enhance the City's tree canopy; and
30	
31	WHEREAS, on January 30, 2019, the Planning and Zoning Board, serving as the Local
32	Planning Agency, considered the proposed amendments to Chapter 32 and afforded all interested
33	persons an opportunity to be heard at the public meeting; and
34	WHEREAS, the City Commission has determined that it is in the best interests of
35	the citizenry and general public to update regulations.

37 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF 38

HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:

40 SECTION 1. Chapter 32, Businesses, is hereby amended to create Article XIV, Medical 41 Cannabis Business Regulations, to read as:

45 Sec. 32-181. - RDO redevelopment overlay.

- District boundaries. For the purpose of defining the boundaries, the RDO redevelopment 46 (a) overlay area is divided into three sectors: the Hallandale Beach Boulevard, the North 47 48 Federal Highway, and the South Federal Highway sectors. The Hallandale Beach 49 Boulevard sector is bounded by I-95 to the west, SW 1 Street, SE 1 Street, Church Drive, 50 and Diana Drive to the south; NW 1 Street and NE 1 Street to the north; and the 51 Intracoastal Waterway to the east. The boundaries of the North Federal Highway sector 52 are: Pembroke Road to the north, NE 3 Avenue to the west, NE 8 Avenue to the east and Hallandale Beach Boulevard to the south. The South Federal Highway sector is all 53 properties which front on South Federal Highway, excluding properties zoned Community 54 Facilities District. All more particularly described in Exhibit A, attached hereto and on file 55 56 in the office of the city clerk.

Sidewalks, fences, walls, and street trees: 58 (i)

(1) Walls: No barbed wire extensions shall be permitted on any wall or fences within the 59 60 overlay district. Chain link and privacy wood fences are prohibited along the corridors.

* * *

- (2) Street trees: The planting of street trees shall be required within the RDO overlay 61 district. The following criteria shall apply to the planting of street trees within the overlay 62 district in the required landscaped perimeter buffer strips: 63
- Street trees may not be counted for credit towards the minimum number of trees 64 a. required by article IV, division 8, "Landscaping Requirements," of the zoning and 65 land development code. 66
- 67 b. Street trees shall be a minimum of 20 feet in height with a minimum diameter of three 68 inches at a point four feet above ground level at the time of planting, and shall have

69 70		trunks which can be maintained in a clean condition for over six feet of clear wood measured from ground level.	
71 72	C.	Street trees shall be spaced, center to center, at a maximum of one tree per 25 linear feet of street frontage, exclusive of accessways.	
73	d.	Street trees shall be of noninvasive root species. The designated street tree for	
74		Hallandale Beach Boulevard and North Federal Highway is the royal palm. The	
75		street tree for all other local streets shall be a species enumerated in the city's	
76		approved plant material list. Street trees shall be a canopy species, planted in the	
77		right-of-way directly in front of the property line(s). The street trees shall be a species	
78		enumerated in the City's Design Guidelines Manual or South Florida Water	
79		Management Publication, Waterwise. Palm varieties may be used at corners,	
80		crosswalks or to accent building entrances and may be permitted in lieu of shade	
81		trees when physical conditions may prevent the proper growth of shade trees, as	
82		determined by the Director of Development Services. Consistency in street species	
83		shall be established on both sides of the street along a block face. The first to	
84		develop shall establish the species for the entire block.	
85	e.	The minimum height required herein for street trees may be modified by the director	
86		of growth management-Development Services, without penalty, in instances where	
87		the installation of trees would interfere with overhead utilities; so long as the	
88		minimum number and spacing of the trees is maintained.

90	<u>SEC</u>	TION 3. Conflict. All ordinances or portions of the Code of Ordinances of the City of	
91	Hallandale Beach in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be repealed to the extent		
92	of such conflict.		
93			
94	<u>SEC</u>	TION 4. Severability. Should any provision of this ordinance be declared by a court	
95	of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a		
96	whole, or an	ny part thereof, other that the part declared to be invalid.	
97			
98	<u>SEC</u>	TION 5. Codification. It is the intention of the Mayor and the City Commission that	
99	the provisions of this ordinance be incorporated into the Code of Ordinances; to effect such		
100	intention the	e words "ordinance" or "section" may be changed to other appropriate words.
