**RESOLUTION NO. 2019-021** 1 2 A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION 3 OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA; 4 AFFIRMING THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH'S 5 COMMITMENT TO THE GOALS CONTAINED IN THE PARIS 6 CLIMATE ACCORD AND THE UNITED NATIONS IPCC 7 SPECIAL REPORT 15 (SR 15); AUTHORIZING 8 Α GREENHOUSE GAS INVENTORY TO DETERMINE THE 9 NECESSARY STEPS TO REDUCE GREENHOUSE GAS 10 **EMISSIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.** 11 12 WHEREAS, there is scientific consensus regarding the reality of climate change and the recognition that human activity, especially the combustion of fossil fuels that 13 create greenhouse gases, is an important driver of climate change; and 14 15 WHEREAS, climate change has been widely recognized by government, business and academic leaders as a worldwide threat with the potential to harm our economy, 16 17 safety, public health, and quality of life; and WHEREAS, the City of Hallandale Beach ("City") actively collaborates with other 18 19 local governments throughout our region, state, nation, and the world to learn from each other and identify win-win opportunities to take action on climate change while creating 20 measurable benefits in our communities; and 21 WHEREAS, the on August 16, 2017 the City Commission approved Resolution 22 23 2017-19 confirming the City's commitment to the Paris Climate Accord, performing a 24 greenhouse gas inventory as soon as feasible and taking the necessary steps to reduce 25 greenhouse gas emissions; and 26 WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) issued

Special Report on Global Warming of 1.5°C (SR15) finding that even with the full implementation of the goals from the Paris Accord, global net emissions are projected to be at 3°C by 2100. Only by reducing carbon dioxide emissions (from 2010 baseline) to 45% by 2030 and 100% by 2055, will the world be able to avoid catastrophic climate impacts; and

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WHEREAS, the world is currently experiencing negative impacts from climate change. Between 1.5°C and 2°C of net global warming, there is a tipping point where conditions for life on Earth becomes miserable at best and hostile at worst. SR15 asserts with high confidence that achieving and sustaining rapid de-carbonization will be required to minimize sea level rise, reduce risks to coral reef ecosystems, and limit impacts to human health and livelihoods in the subsequent decades and centuries; and

WHEREAS, the City has not yet adopted a greenhouse gas reduction plan. However, the Sustainability Action Plan includes a 2019-targeted project to conduct a greenhouse gas emission inventory and set reduction targets. In order for the City to affirm and act on its support for the Paris Agreement and SR15, it must have a baseline greenhouse gas emission inventory; and

WHEREAS, upon the completion of a greenhouse gas emission inventory, the City
will be able to address greenhouse gas concerns by making its buildings, facilities and its
fleet more efficient; by creating and enforcing a regular maintenance plan; by
implementing retrofitting projects and establishing procurement requirements to buy
energy efficient products; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission find that it is in the best interest of the residents to authorize a full-scale greenhouse gas emission inventory within the next fiscal year and to further strive to reduce emissions by 45% by 2030 and 100% by 2055. The City will register its eventual plan on the Non-State Action Zone for Climate Action (NAZCA) website. This platform houses over 6,000 commitments by subnational governments around the world and provides transparent reporting pertaining to progress made towards fulfilling stated goals.

55 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY 56 COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:

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**SECTION 1.** The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby incorporated herein.

59 **SECTION 2.** The Mayor and City Commission of Hallandale Beach affirm the City's 60 commitment to the goals contained in the Paris Climate Accord and SR 15. In furtherance 61 of its commitment the City Commission authorizes the expenditure not to exceed fifteen

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thousand (\$15,000) dollars to perform a greenhouse gas inventory to determine thenecessary steps to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

64 **SECTION 3.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage and 65 adoption.
