

RESOLUTION NO. 2019-030

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, ENDORSING APPLICATIONS TO THE BROWARD METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION SEEKING GRANT FUNDING UNDER THE COMPLETE STREETS AND OTHER LOCALIZED INITIATIVES PROGRAM FOR THE N.W. 3RD STREET COMPLETE STREET REVITALIZATION PROJECT; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE ALL NECESSARY DOCUMENTS TO SUBMIT APPLICATIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the MPO's Complete Streets and other Localized Initiatives Grant Program (CSLIP) provides funding for small local transportation projects which improve the safety and mobility for all transportation users in Broward County; and

WHEREAS, a complete street is a street where the entire right of way is planned, designed, and operated for all modes of transportation and all users regardless of age or ability. Pedestrians, bicyclists, transit riders, and motorists of all ages and abilities must be able to safely move along and across a complete street. Complete streets make it easy to cross the street, walk to shops, catch the bus, and bike to work; and

WHEREAS, the proposed application is for a complete street revitalization project on NW 3rd Street from Dixie Highway west to NW 5th Terrace. This project addresses deficiencies in the existing segment from Dixie Highway to NW 6 Avenue. NW 3rd Street can be characterized as a slum and blighted corridor with a lack of formalized on-street parking and gaps in the existing narrow sidewalk network; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project would implement formalized parallel on-street parking, maintain one (1) continuous travel lane in each direction, address all American with Disabilities Act (ADA) deficiencies, provide buffered bicycle lanes, install curb and gutter drainage, increase landscape opportunities, and result in a continuous 7-foot wide sidewalk network from U.S. 1 to NW 6th Avenue (NW 5th Terrace); and

38 **WHEREAS**, if the grant is awarded, the State’s funding will become available in five years;
39 the City will be required to program its matching funds in the same timeframe. The estimated
40 cost of construction is \$1,726,971. The City’s required match is estimated to be \$377,387; and

42 **WHEREAS**, in order to obtain the funding the agency requires a commitment from the City
43 to fund the sidewalk work within the existing ROW on the north and south sides of the road
44 between Dixie Highway and NW 5th Terrace; the City must also commit to fund the landscaping,
45 utilities, all roadway maintenance, and any portion of the project construction costs that exceeds
46 three (3) million dollars; and

48 **WHEREAS**, City Administration is recommending the Commission endorses the NW 3rd
49 Street Complete Street Revitalization Project grant application in order to be awarded funding
50 from the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization’s Complete Streets and other Localized
51 Initiatives Program, agrees to have the Florida Department of Transportation fully administer the
52 design and construction phases of the project and deliver the projects on the city’s behalf, and
53 commits to maintain the roadways and signal systems after the projects are completed; and

55 **WHEREAS**, the Mayor and City Commission have determined that the administration’s
56 recommendations are in the best interest of the City and its residents.

58 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION**
59 **OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:**
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61 **SECTION 1.** The foregoing “Whereas” clauses are incorporated herein.
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63 **SECTION 2. Approval of NW 3rd Street Complete Street Revitalization Project.** The
64 Mayor and City Commission hereby approves of the NW 3rd Street Complete Street Revitalization
65 Project as proposed and agrees identify and appropriate funding as necessary to complete the
66 project if the contemplated grant funding is awarded. It is further agreed that the Florida
67 Department of Transportation will fully administer the design and construction phases of the
68 project and deliver the projects on the city’s behalf as part of the grant award. The City will then
69 maintain the roadways and signal systems after the projects are completed.
70

SECTION 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage and adoption.
