2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16	A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO AWARD RFP #FY2015-2016-006, DISASTER DEBRIS REMOVAL AND DISPOSAL WITH THE HIGHEST RATED FIRM ASHBRITT ENVIRONMENTAL AS THE PRIMARY CONTRACTOR, AND CROWDER GULF AS THE SECONDARY CONTRACTOR; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER AND CITY ATTORNEY TO NEGOTIATE AND EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH ASHBRITT ENVIRONMENTAL AS THE PRIMARY CONTRACTOR, AND CROWDER GULF AS THE SECONDARY CONTRACTOR; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
17 18	WHEREAS, pursuant to chapter 23, section 23-6, the City Manager shall have the
19	authority to recommend to the City Commission award of contracts; and
20	
21	WHEREAS, the City, like many other cities, is vulnerable to both man-made and
22	natural disasters. Man-made disasters refer to instances of civil unrest and terrorist
23	attacks, while natural disasters include events such as hurricanes, tornadoes, windstorms,
24	floods and fires; and
25 26 27	WHEREAS, the City desires to enter into pre-need, pre-event contract with a qualified/experienced emergency and debris management firm responsible for removing
28	and lawfully disposing of disaster generated debris from public property and public
29	maintained right-of-ways during a disaster or emergency event; and
30	
31	WHEREAS, the chosen contractor must have experience in the specialized
32	management of disaster response labor for the removal of debris, as well as the
33	preparation, response, recovery, and mitigation phases of any emergency or disaster; and
34	
35	WHEREAS, on June 15, 2016, the City Commission awarded RFP #FY2015-
36	2016-007 Disaster Debris Monitoring to Eisman & Russo; and
37	
38	WHEREAS, in the event of a disaster, Eisman & Russo will also monitor the
39	progress of the City's debris monitoring firm; and

40	WHEREAS, the selected disaster debris removal and disposal services firm must
41	adhere to all requirements and regulations established by FEMA, the Federal Highway
42	Administration, the Florida Department of Transportation, the Natural Resources
43	Conservation Service, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and any other governmental
44	agency with jurisdiction over response and recovery actions; and
45	
46	WHEREAS, on January 29, 2016, the City advertised RFP #FY2015-2016-006. It
47	was advertised in the Sun Sentinel, posted on the City's website, DemandStar, and on
48	Facebook, published by the Chamber of Commerce, emailed to vendors that were
49	previously registered for this commodity and sent to the Minority Business Development
50	Agencies; and
51	
52	WHEREAS, the RFP sought proposals from qualified firms to provide the City with
53	Disaster Debris Removal and disposal services; and
54	
55	WHEREAS, the City intends to award a primary and secondary contractor for
56	services under RFP #2015-2016-006. The primary contractor selected will be the initial
57	firm mobilized by the City and the secondary contractor will be utilized in instances where
58	the scope of the events merits additional resources to assist the primary contractor, or if
59	the primary contractor is unavailable; and
60	
61	WHEREAS, on February 9, 2016, a non-mandatory pre-proposal conference was
62	held and eight (8) vendors attended the meeting; and
63	
64	WHEREAS, the City received seven (7) responses to the Disaster Debris Removal
65	and Disposal Services RFP. Of the seven (7) responses, only six (6) were rated by the
66	Evaluation committee; and
67	
68	WHEREAS, on April 13, 2016, and on April 21, 2016, the evaluation committee
69	met in order to review and discuss the proposals; and
70	
71	WHEREAS, on June 20, 2016, Ashbritt, Inc. was invited to provide an oral
72	presentation, and on June 21 ,2016, Crowder Gulf was invited to provide an oral
73	presentation; and

74	
75	WHEREAS, the City Administration is recommending the award of RFP #FY2015-
76	2016-006 to Ashbritt Environmental as the primary contractor and Crowder Gulf as the
77	secondary contractor; and
78	
79	WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission find that the award of RFP #FY2015-
80	2016-006 to Ashbritt Environmental as the primary contractor and Crowder Gulf as the
81	secondary contractor is in the best interest of the City and its residents.
82	
83	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY
84	COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:
85	
86	SECTION 1. City Commission Action. The Mayor and City Commission
87	hereby award RFP FY #2015-2016-006, Disaster Debris Removal and Disposal to the
88	highest ranked firm, Ashbritt Environmental as the primary contractor, and Crowder Gulf
89	as the Secondary Contractor.
90	
91	SECTION 2. City Manager and City Attorney Authorization. The Mayor and
92	City Commission hereby authorize the City Manager and City Attorney to negotiate and
93	execute an agreement with the highest ranked firm, Ashbritt Environmental as the primary
94	contractor, and Crowder Gulf as the Secondary Contractor.

96	SECTION 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon
97	its passage and adoption.
